03.53.24 DANIEL (OS)-You okay?

03.54.11 O'NEILL-Yeah.

04.01.08 GENERAL HAMMOND-Colonel O'Neill, what happened?

04.04.04 O'NEILL-We encountered some very severe volcanic
 activity, sir.

04.09.27 GENERAL HAMMOND-Who are all these people?

04.10.01 CARTER (OS)-We don't really...

04.10.09 CARTER (CONT)-know, sir. They were all dead and dying
 around the gate. The air was highly toxic.

04.14.17 DANIEL-And hot.

04.16.12 GENERAL HAMMOND-You better have Doctor Frasier take a
look at you.

04.18.20 GENERAL HAMMOND (OS CONT)-We'll debrief as soon as you're
ready.

04.19.24 O'NEILL-Yes, sir.

04.20.08 GENERAL HAMMOND (OS)-You evacuated ten people from an
alien planet, Colonel.

04.26.09 GENERAL HAMMOND (CONT)-Dr. Frasier says they're all
human, and it looks like they're going to live.
This was one hell of a rescue operation.

04.32.02 O'NEILL-Thank you, sir.

04.33.12 GENERAL HAMMOND-There were no buildings...

04.34.14 GENERAL HAMMOND (OS CONT)-in the area of any kind?

04.36.01 CARTER-No, sir. We don't know how far they walked, but
it looked like they were trying to make it back to
the Stargate.

05.06.26 DANIEL (OS)-Yes.

05.09.03 DANIEL (CONT)-We'd be colonizing space right now, if it hadn't been for the Dark Ages. There was a period of over eight hundred years where science was heresy and anathema. Maybe they didn't have that setback.

05.19.07 AIRMAN-General Hammond? The spokesman for the rescued people is awake. He'd like to speak with you. All of you.

05.30.19 MALE TECHNICIAN (VO ON P.A. FILTERED)-Attention, all
offsetting medical personal. Report to the
Infirmary, sub-level twenty, stat.

05.52.04 OMOC-Who are you?

05.53.21 GENERAL HAMMOND-I'm Major General Hammond. This is
Colonel O'Neill.

05.56.21 O'NEILL-Jack.

05.58.06 CARTER-Samantha Carter.

05.59.21 DANIEL-Uh, Daniel Jackson --

06.00.19 OMOC (overlapping)-What is this place?

06.02.27 GENERAL HAMMOND-You're on a planet called Earth. These
people saved you.

06.06.14 OMOC-Nothing could be further from the truth.

06.10.10 DANIEL (OS)-Well, unless I...

06.11.11 DANIEL (CONT)-missed something, you're better off here
than you were there.

06.14.27 OMOC-There was a rescue transport on the way.

06.16.20 O'NEILL-Well, half your people were already dead. I
don't think it would've gotten there on time.

06.20.17 OMOC-Perhaps that's more of a problem for you than it was
for us.

06.23.18 O'NEILL-Beg your pardon?

06.24.22 OMOC-I find it unbelievable that anyone so primitive...

06.28.07 OMOC (OS CONT)-could've deciphered the gate system.

06.32.16 O'NEILL-Did you say "primitive"?

06.34.05 TEAL'C (OS)-I too am from a world...

06.35.07 TEAL'C (CONT)-very different from this one. (beat) Here
life is highly valued.

06.40.19 OMOC-Quite a statement for a Jaffa.

06.47.03 GENERAL HAMMOND-Sir... I'd like to know who you are...

06.49.16 GENERAL HAMMOND (OS CONT)-and what you know about the
Goa'uld.

06.51.04 OMOC-I am Omoc. Our world is called Tollan.

06.56.06 GENERAL HAMMOND-And what do you know of the Goa'uld and Jaffa?

07.00.03 OMOC-We're aware of them. We don't interact with them.

07.03.22 GENERAL HAMMOND-Well, then, we share a common enemy.

07.07.27 OMOC-Did I mention an enemy?

07.11.04 GENERAL HAMMOND-I only meant it might benefit everybody
if your people and ours could be friends.

07.17.20 OMOC-I demand that you return everything that you've
 taken from us...

07.20.18 OMO (OS CONT)-and allow us to go.

07.23.25 DANIEL-Well, it, it could take a while for those
volcanoes to quiet down.

07.27.20 DANIEL (OS CONT)-In the meantime, I'm a bit of a culture buff.

07.30.03 DANIEL (CONT)-I'd like to learn about your history and customs.

07.34.05 OMOC-I've said enough. I'll say no more.

07.59.07 GENERAL HAMMOND-Captain Carter, I want you to monitor the situation on Tollan very closely. As soon as it's safe there, I want those people gone.

08.06.04 CARTER-Yes, sir.

08.24.22 DANIEL-New hobby?

08.26.04 CARTER-Neat, huh? Miniature UAV, with all the bells and whistles. I'm just adding heat sensors, so I can send it through the gate to Tollan.

08.33.26 DANIEL-Mmm. I was just down in the infirmary with one of the Tollan, trying to get them to talk to us. They only ask questions, never answer them. As a matter of fact, one of them was asking a lot of questions about you.

08.45.22 CARTER-I thought they weren't interested in us.

08.48.19 DANIEL-Oh, I didn't say "us". I said "you". General Hammond thinks maybe you'll have better luck getting some answers. He'd like to see you.

08.58.14 CARTER-Okay.

09.00.15 GENERAL HAMMOND (OS)-And I was hoping he would open up...

09.01.13 GENERAL HAMMOND (CONT)-to you a bit more than Dr. Jackson
or myself. You remember Narim...?

09.10.10 CARTER-Yes, from the planet. You were a lot dirtier
then...

09.15.22 NARIM-Captain Carter... or is it Doctor?

09.18.14 CARTER-Why don't we just make it Samantha.

09.20.18 NARIM-You may call me Narim.

09.22.20 CARTER-Okay.

09.23.01 GENERAL HAMMOND (OS)-Captain Carter... Mr. Narim seems
very interested in our planet. I thought maybe
you'd like to...

09.28.03 GENERAL HAMMOND (CONT)-escort him up to the surface to
have a look.

09.31.08 CARTER-Really?

09.32.08 NARIM (OS)-I would be very pleased...

09.32.27 NARIM (CONT)-to have that opportunity.

09.35.02 GENERAL HAMMOND (OS)-As long as you give me your word...

09.35.26 GENERAL HAMMOND (CONT)-you'll stay with Captain Carter.

09.38.07 NARIM-You have my word.

09.40.06 CARTER-Great. Let's go. Sir...

10.02.03 NARIM-Um... I wanted to tell you that I'm glad to be
 alive. Um, so are the others.

10.09.14 CARTER-Good.

10.10.02 NARIM-Thank you. And please tell your friends.

10.12.18 CARTER-Oh... You can tell them yourself.

10.14.18 NARIM-No. I can't. I shouldn't be talking to you.

10.18.12 CARTER-Why not?

10.21.00 NARIM-You know, back on Tollan, I thought I was dying. I
 heard your voice, and managed to open my eyes, and,
 uh... when I saw you, um...

10.31.18 CARTER-What?

10.34.05 NARIM-An old superstition. There was a time, before reason and science, when my ancestors believed in all manner of nonsense... like the Sher-Mal. The story goes that if a Sher-Mal appears at the moment of death, she will take you to her dwelling in the stars.

10.48.19 CARTER-Ah. We call them angels.

10.51.27 NARIM-Then you still believe in them?

10.53.21 CARTER-Some of us do.

10.55.20 NARIM-Ours were reported to be quite beautiful. And when I saw you, well... you seemed to fit the description. And then I learned from Dr. Jackson that you're also a brilliant scientist.

11.10.26 CARTER-Wow...

11.11.22 NARIM (OS)-I'm afraid I asked quite a few questions.

11.15.03 NARIM (CONT)-Curiosity.

11.16.12 CARTER-It's a quality Omoc doesn't seem to share.

11.20.08 NARIM-Can you tell me something about your world? Is it permitted?

11.22.12 CARTER-Well, yeah. Of course.

11.31.13 NARIM-A flying animal!

11.33.06 CARTER-Yeah. We call them birds.

11.36.24 NARIM-Are there other animals?

11.38.05 CARTER-Oh, yeah. Millions of them.

11.42.22 NARIM-There have been none on Tollan for generations.

11.47.13 CARTER-Well, I could bring you pictures, if you like.

11.52.17 NARIM-I would like that very much. Thank you.

11.55.00 CARTER-Okay.

11.56.04 NARIM (OS)-But I think it would be best if...

11.56.24 NARIM (CONT)-Omoc didn't know.

11.59.00 CARTER-Why?

12.01.00 NARIM-Omoc is not as harsh as he seems. He is only
trying to protect us. And you.

12.08.04 CARTER-From what?

12.09.08 NARIM-Perhaps... (beat) Perhaps we should go back.

12.21.19 CARTER-Okay.

12.25.14 TECHNICIAN (VO ON P.A. FILTERED)-Chevron six, engaged.
Chevron seven, locked.

12.38.05 CARTER (VO ON P.A. FILTERED)-Launching UAV in ten
seconds... nine...

12.42.20 CARTER (CONT ON P.A. FILTERED)-eight... seven... six...
five... four...

12.49.03 CARTER (VO CONT ON P.A. FILTERED)-three... two... one...

12.56.06 O'NEILL-Yeah.

12.57.02 CARTER (OS)-Successful launch. UAV is holding course in
the wormhole.

13.00.10 CARTER (CONT)-Should reach the Tollan gate in three...
two... one... Temperature -- ground, 1700 degrees
Fahrenheit.

13.10.28 CARTER (OS CONT)-Air seems to be in pockets ranging
from...

13.13.04 CARTER (CONT)-1500 degrees down to 200.

13.15.14 O'NEILL-Sounds like L.A.

13.17.08 CARTER (OS)-If the heat doesn't get you, the atmosphere
will.

13.19.10 CARTER (CONT)-It's mostly pyroclastics, basalt... ash. A
person could suffocate very quickly.

13.24.18 O'NEILL-How long before it cools down?

13.27.08 CARTER-I don't know. Not any time soon.

13.31.00 CARTER (OS CONT)-It doesn't look like it'll matter
anyway. That lava's flowing straight toward the
gate.

13.36.15 CARTER (CONT)-Computer predicts that at the current rate,
the gate will be buried in a couple of days.

13.43.03 O'NEILL-Well, looks like we've got some guests for a
while.

13.48.14 OMOC-Are you absolutely certain?

13.50.08 CARTER (OS)-Yes. I'm sorry.

13.55.13 OMOC-Then nature succeeded where we failed.

13.59.04 DANIEL-What? You were going to seal the gate?

14.03.00 OMOC-Tollan is a world in cataclysm.

14.06.11 OMOC (OS CONT)-The evacuation was complete.

14.07.27 OMOC (CONT)-My team stayed to, uh... (beat) Our final task was to close the gate so that no one could return and be harmed.

14.22.02 CARTER-Well, wherever you were going, we can recalibrate the coordinates from here.

14.25.23 OMOC-The new settlement world is outside the gate system. We'll need a ship.

14.30.27 DANIEL-Oh, uh... We don't have ships. Not that kind, anyway.

14.36.18 CARTER-Our space program is relatively new.

14.42.10 GENERAL HAMMOND-Well, the bottom line here is your survivors have become refugees. If they don't want to be here, we've got to relocate them somewhere.

14.49.15 O'NEILL-You know, General, we have done some fairly good deeds out there. Maybe we should try calling in some markers.

14.56.21 GENERAL HAMMOND-Okay. Colonel, you and Teal'c...

14.59.08 GENERAL HAMMOND (OS CONT)-follow up on that. Maybe go
pay a visit to some of our old friends. Captain
Carter, I want you and...

15.04.23 GENERAL HAMMOND (CONT)-Dr. Jackson to get the multi-
purpose room on 5C readied...

15.07.28 GENERAL HAMMOND (OS CONT)-as a refugee housing center.

15.10.21 O'NEILL-Yes, sir.

15.16.07 GENERAL HAMMOND (OS)-As an act of good faith,...

15.18.00 GENERAL HAMMOND (CONT)-we're returning the devices you
were wearing.

15.20.21 OMOC-They are not weapons.

15.22.01 GENERAL HAMMOND-That's what our technicians thought.

15.24.11 OMOC-So you had them tested? Not much of an act of good
faith.

15.29.14 DANIEL-Well, actually, we couldn't figure out exactly
what they were.

15.33.03 GENERAL HAMMOND-I want to assure you we're doing all we
can to relocate your people.

15.39.09 OMOC-Are we to have some say in the matter?

15.41.02 DANIEL (OS)-Oh, yes!

15.41.26 DANIEL (CONT)-Self-determination is a concept that's very important to us.

15.44.11 GENERAL HAMMOND (OS)-We'll do our best. In the meantime, we'll make...

15.45.29 GENERAL HAMMOND (CONT)-you as comfortable as possible. But I want you to understand you're restricted to the immediate premises.

15.51.25 OMOC-Are we prisoners?

15.52.26 DANIEL (OS)-No.

15.53.22 DANIEL (CONT)-No, absolutely not.

15.55.12 GENERAL HAMMOND-But you are from an alien environment. It's as much for your safety as for ours.

16.14.14 CARTER-Hey. How you doin'?

16.16.23 NARIM-Um... It may sound ridiculous, but I have no idea what to do with these items. Oh, well, our sleeping platforms adjust automatically to our body temperature. They don't come with accouterments.

16.30.00 CARTER-It's okay. I'll show you. Uh, I brought you some
things to take a look at.

16.33.19 NARIM-Oh. Thank you.

16.40.20 CARTER-You're welcome. (beat) Uh, you, you might like
to see this first.

16.57.28 NARIM-I never thought I'd see a living animal.

16.59.28 CARTER (OS)-His name's...

17.00.03 CARTER (CONT)-Schrodinger.

17.05.28 CARTER (OS CONT)-It's kind of a joke, really.

17.07.16 CARTER (CONT)-His name, that is. Schrodinger's cat.

17.11.04 NARIM-Oh?

17.13.25 CARTER-Right. See, there was an Earth physicist by the
name of Erwin Schrodinger.

17.18.15 CARTER (OS CONT)-He had this theoretical experiment.

17.20.15 CARTER (CONT)-Put a cat in a box, add a can of poison gas
activated by the decay of a radioactive atom, and
close the box.

17.28.03 NARIM-Sounds like a cruel man.

17.29.02 CARTER (OS)-Oh, no!

17.29.15 CARTER (CONT)-No. It was just a theory. He never really did it.

17.32.07 CARTER (OS CONT)-He said that if he did do it,...

17.33.11 CARTER (CONT)-at any one instant, the cat would be both dead...

17.35.19 CARTER (OS CONT)-and alive at the same time.

17.37.07 NARIM-Ah ha. Quilebrium physics. (beat) An atom's state is indeterminate until measured by an outside observer.

17.43.03 CARTER-We call it quantum physics. You know the theory.

17.46.11 NARIM-Yeah, I've studied it. In among other misconceptions of elementary science.

17.52.19 CARTER-Misconceptions? Are you telling me that you guys have licked quantum physics?

18.00.16 NARIM-Omoc...

18.07.03 CARTER-Uh, I'll come back and help you with this later.

18.18.19 NARIM-I did not tell her anything.

18.27.23 O'NEILL-We've set up a meeting with Tuplo for 0800
tomorrow.

18.30.24 TEAL'C-Colonel O'Neill was correct. Many of the worlds
we have visited are eager to be of service.

18.34.18 GENERAL HAMMOND-People! We have a problem. Your
refugees seem to have escaped.

18.38.20 CARTER (OS)-Escaped?

18.39.14 O'NEILL-How'd they get past the guards?

18.40.20 GENERAL HAMMOND-You can ask them that when you find them.

18.54.13 GUARD (OS)-They're over here!

18.58.10 O'NEILL-Hold fire!

19.22.03 OMOC-We were merely observing the stars.

19.25.03 O'NEILL-Well, you're all going to have to come back in
now.

19.27.28 OMOC-So we are prisoners.

19.33.19 O'NEILL-Any idea how they got past the guards, sir?

19.35.22 GENERAL HAMMOND-None. The surveillance video in the multi-purpose room was exposed to some sort of interference just as the escape was taking place.

19.42.02 O'NEILL-Convenient.

19.43.05 CARTER-Can the video be salvaged? Maybe computer enhanced?

19.45.24 GENERAL HAMMOND-We're trying now. In the meantime, we should get this show on the road.

20.00.06 O'NEILL-Tuplo...

20.01.14 TUPLO-Good to see you. General Hammond, before we begin, I wish to thank you...

20.08.05 TUPLO (OS CONT)-for allowing me to be the first visitor to your earth...

20.11.05 TUPLO (CONT)-from the Land of Light. It is indeed an honor. (beat) My Lord Omoc...

20.23.13 TUPLO (OS CONT)-The Land of Light is a world of eternal brightness...

20.27.17 TUPLO (CONT)-where fertility abounds.

20.29.23 TUPLO (OS CONT)-Our farms produce...

20.31.09 TUPLO (CONT)-rich harvests.

20.32.28 TUPLO (OS CONT)-Our rivers are blessed with fish and
fowl. We would be honored...

20.38.15 TUPLO (CONT)-to share our land with your people.

20.45.06 OMOC-You have no idea who or what we are.

20.52.04 TUPLO-We know that you are in need.

20.54.02 TUPLO (OS CONT)-And that you are here among those who
have proven themselves...

20.56.06 TUPLO (CONT)-our friends. That is enough.

21.03.03 OMOC-You're missing the point. (beat) His planet is
unacceptable...

21.12.24 OMOC (OS CONT)-to us. These people...

21.17.09 OMOC (CONT)-are even more primitive than you.

21.27.23 CARTER (OS)-Narim, can you tell why Omoc is so... you
know... ?

21.32.12 NARIM-Obstinate?

21.33.22 CARTER-Yeah.

21.36.11 NARIM-The nearest planet in our solar system was called
Sarita. When we began to explore space, we learned
she was inhabited.

21.44.06 CARTER-Did you make contact?

21.45.09 NARIM-Yes. When we thought they were sufficiently advanced. They were on a level very similar to yours.

21.52.11 CARTER-So what happened?

21.55.00 NARIM-We offered them a device to produce unlimited productive energy. (beat) And they used it to make war.

22.04.03 CARTER-Ah. How bad was it?

22.07.23 NARIM-in one rotation of our planet, they had destroyed theirs.

22.13.18 CARTER-One day?

22.14.18 NARIM (OS)-The destruction shifted our planet's...

22.15.24 NARIM (CONT)-orbit .3 decana. Enough to begin a chain of events that made our world unstable.

22.23.10 CARTER (OS)-So that would explain why he's so...

22.24.15 CARTER (CONT)-afraid to give a society like ours any of your technology.

22.28.01 NARIM-Yes.

22.31.03 CARTER-Tell me. What... What were you really doing
 outside last night?

22.34.18 NARIM-Omoc spoke the truth. By studying the position of
 you stars, we were able to calibrate the distance
 between earth and the new home world. It is very
 far away, Samantha. Too far to hope for a ship in
 our lifetime.

22.54.21 CARTER-Have you ever thought about staying here? On
 earth?

22.59.28 NARIM-I would gladly stay. If only to spend more time
 with a certain inhabitant of this planet. (beat) I
 speak, of course, of Schrodinger.

23.18.24 OMOC (OS)-Our escape was a test.

23.21.11 OMOC (CONT)-You did exactly what I knew you would do.
 You used threat and force to solve your problem.

23.26.19 CARTER-You didn't give us any other choice.

23.28.17 OMOC-You could have come for us unarmed.

23.30.06 O'NEILL-Hey, you haven't exactly behaved like someone I want to trust. I'm not gonna put my team at risk.

23.35.10 OMOC-And I am not going to risk my people in your care.

23.40.08 O'NEILL-Look, Omoc... If you're so advanced, why don't you let your people decide for themselves?

23.48.13 CARTER-Narim, this is a free country. Every year, we take in thousands of refugees fleeing repression. If you request asylum, you can stay here, no matter what Omoc wants.

25.09.12 MAYBORNE (OS)-That's exactly what the President...

25.10.19 MAYBORNE (CONT)-and Joint Chiefs want to hear. (beat)
 Colonel Mayborne, sir. N.I.D.

25.18.26 O'NEILL-Intelligence? What happened to Kennedy?

25.21.28 MAYBORNE-Promoted. I took his place.

25.23.27 O'NEILL-Promoted? Talk about failing upwards...

25.27.23 MAYBORNE-Colonel O'Neill. I read about your conflict
with Colonel Kennedy in his report.

25.32.19 MAYBORNE (OS CONT)-I assure you, such an attitude will
not...

25.34.07 MAYBORNE (CONT)-prevail with me in either direction.

25.37.19 O'NEILL-I sense that.

25.39.17 MAYBORNE-Good.

25.40.21 GENERAL HAMMOND (OS)-Would you mind telling me...

25.41.09 GENERAL HAMMOND (CONT)-exactly why you're here, Colonel?

25.43.25 MAYBORNE-You didn't get my advance?

25.53.01 MAYBORNE (OS)-That's an order releasing the Tollans to
our section.

25.56.12 MAYBORNE (CONT)-You're to be congratulated, General.

25.58.07 MAYBORNE (OS CONT)-The Stargate Program is finally paying
off.

26.00.21 MAYBORNE (CONT)-This was quite a coup.

26.03.01 DANIEL (OS)-Excuse me?

26.04.20 DANIEL (CONT)-These are people we're talking about.

26.06.14 O'NEILL-These people do have rights, you know.

26.08.11 MAYBORNE (OS)-Do they?

release these people until they've been through
quarantine.

26.23.14 GENERAL HAMMOND (OS CONT)-We don't have any idea what
kinds of...

26.25.12 GENERAL HAMMOND (CONT)-diseases they might be carrying.

26.29.01 MAYBORNE-You're out of your league here, gentlemen.

26.30.24 MAYBORNE (OS CONT)-We're playing in my ballpark now.

26.32.25 MAYBORNE (CONT)-And I have the full authority of the President.

26.37.04 GENERAL HAMMOND-So do I, Colonel. Why don't you ask the Airman outside...

26.45.22 MAYBORNE-That's okay. I'll wait.

27.03.27 O'NEILL (CONT)-Didn't Dr. Frazier give the Tollans a clean bill of health?

27.14.10 GENERAL HAMMOND (OS CONT)-At most, I've bought us a day, people.

27.17.01 GENERAL HAMMOND (CONT)-Find me some alternatives.

27.20.01 O'NEILL-You're a good man, General.

27.24.00 NARIM-Then it doesn't matter if I ask for asylum?

27.26.03 CARTER-Oh, Mayborne'd love that. But you'd be working for him, on his terms.

27.31.15 NARIM-Then Omoc is correct. Your people will use our knowledge for war.

27.34.20 CARTER-It's not us. We are dealing with another part of our government. One that specializes in chronic paranoia.

27.39.24 NARIM-Like Sarita. It's going to happen again.

27.42.13 CARTER-It doesn't have to. That's why I'm here. Narim, I am hoping that you can convince Omoc to consider one of the other planets we've presented.

27.50.03 NARIM-Look, it's no use. He's right. They're all as primitive or more primitive than you are. Sarita could happen on any of them.

28.45.17 GENERAL HAMMOND-I just hung up from talking to the President. I guess Mr. Mayborne has been talking to him recently.

28.51.18 MAYBORNE-I did tell you I had his ear, General.

28.54.12 GENERAL HAMMOND-Colonel Mayborne has full authorization...

28.56.10 GENERAL HAMMOND (OS CONT)-to relocate the Tollans immediately.

28.59.06 O'NEILL-Of course, he does.

29.04.03 TEAL'C-To where will you take them?

29.05.18 MAYBORNE-To a secure community here in the Rockies.

29.08.07 O'NEILL (OS)-Nice little community...

29.08.26 O'NEILL (CONT)-with high walls, guards, maybe a little
 barbed wire...

29.12.00 MAYBORNE (OS)-They're a valuable asset.

29.14.17 MAYBORNE (CONT)-They need to be protected.

29.16.04 DANIEL-Nice. Forced intellectual labor.

29.18.21 CARTER-And life imprisonment.

29.20.06 MAYBORNE (OS)-These aliens will live a better life...

29.21.10 MAYBORNE (CONT)-than most Americans. They'll have a
 great view, the best food, every convenience,
 everything they need...

29.28.15 O'NEILL-Everything except a life.

29.31.10 DANIEL-The Pentagon... Intelligence... That I can
 understand. But the President... I voted for him!

29.38.06 MAYBORNE (OS)-Colonel...

29.38.24 MAYBORNE (CONT)-Have the Tollans ready for transport at
0600 tomorrow.

29.58.22 GENERAL HAMMOND-Okay, Colonel. Want to tell me why I'm
here?

30.01.19 O'NEILL-Because Mayborne isn't, sir.

30.03.25 CARTER (OS)-Sir, we wanted to talk to you...

30.04.26 CARTER (CONT)-about what we could to keep Mayborne from
taking the Tollan.

30.07.28 TEAL'C-General, we must ensure the Tollans escape.

30.11.00 GENERAL HAMMOND-I can't let you do that. We'd all be

35.16.21 CARTER-Narim?

35.23.28 NARIM-Hello.

35.28.11 NARIM (OS)-Very...

35.30.00 NARIM (CONT)-carefully. I have come to say goodbye.

35.38.07 NARIM (OS CONT)-We'll be leaving soon.
