07.07.07 O'NEILL-Why not?

07.09.14 CARTER-Because of the grandfather paradox.  
CARTER (OS CONT)-If you went back fifty years and murdered your own grandfather,...

CARTER (CONT)-...your own father would never have been born.

07.17.04 DANIEL (OS)-So you're saying that if we...  
DANIEL (CONT)-...change our own past...



- 07.20.01 CARTER-We could change our world in ways that we can't possibly imagine. But we might even cease to exist, along with everything and everyone that we know.
- 07.28.00 TEAL'C-I myself have no part in the history of your world.
- 07.30.13 CARTER-But when they find out about the Goa'uld threat, they might have second thoughts about opening the Stargate in the first place. In which case, we never meet, and you're back to being First Prime of Apophis.

08.34.27 DANIEL-Nyet.

08.35.23 O'NEILL-Daniel?

08.37.03 DANIEL-He just asked if we were Soviet spies. I just...

08.43.25 SERGEANT-Come with me.

08.46.28 O'NEILL-Sure.  
O'NEILL (OS CONT)-You bet.  
O'NEILL (CONT)-"Nyet"...?

09.09.10 THORNBIRD-I'm Major Robert Thornbird. And you are...?

09.20.00 O'NEILL-Captain James T. Kirk, of the Starship  
Enterprise.

09.24.25 THORNBIRD-Your dog-tags say otherwise.

09.28.01 O'NEILL-They're lying.

09.30.00 THORNBIRD-Your American accent is very impressive, Mr.  
Kirk. Before we ship you out and hand you over to  
wherever it is they take spies such as yourself... I  
wanted a word. Your little incursion into our  
training facility is going to leave an embarrassing  
mark on my record.

09.50.19 O'NEILL-Training facility...?

09.51.24 THORNBIRD-You don't think we'd test fire a real missile  
twenty eight floors inside a mountain, do you?

09.56.12 O'NEILL-Listen, you don't have the exact date -- ?

09.58.26 THORNBIRD-What was the weapon you used?

10.03.05 O'NEILL-Weapon?

10.04.04 THORNBIRD-Our cameras saw some sort of weapon.

10.06.22 O'NEILL (OS)-Oh.  
O'NEILL (CONT)-Well, it's hard to say...

10.10.13 THORNBIRD-Some sort of state secret?

10.12.21 O'NEILL-No. Just difficult to pronounce.

10.19.00 THORNBIRD-Mister, my government doesn't take kindly to  
Soviet spies in its highest security facilities.  
(beat) Neither do I.

10.28.21 O'NEILL-Oh... Bob -- can I call you Bob?

10.30.14 THORNBIRD-Even though you achieved nothing --

10.32.18 O'NEILL-Unless that's exactly what we were trying to  
achieve.

10.36.00 THORNBIRD-Kirk, you can talk to me, or you can talk to  
the CIA.

10.43.28 O'NEILL-Ooo. All right. (beat) I'll be honest with  
you, Bob. My name's not Kirk. (beat) It's  
Skywalker. Luke Skywalker.

11.21.09           TECHNICIAN-Still no sign of SG-1, sir. They never made  
                  it to P2X 555.

11.25.09           GENERAL HAMMOND-Very well. SG-5 will have to complete  
                  their mission.

11.29.14           TECHNICIAN-If I may ask, sir, what are we going to do  
                  about SG-1?

11.32.19           GENERAL HAMMOND-They're out there somewhere. Hopefully,  
                  they'll find their way back.

11.36.28           TECHNICIAN-Shouldn't we start a search?

11.40.17           GENERAL HAMMOND-I'm afraid this is one mission they're on  
                  their own.

11.44.13           TECHNICIAN-Yes, sir.

11.54.00           O'NEILL-Listen... I don't know where we're headed, but  
                  they'll probably try to split us up. So we won't  
                  have much time to --

11.59.21           CARTER (OS)-Escape and...  
                  CARTER (CONT)-...hopefully live out the rest of our lives

12.05.20 CARTER-I can't think of an "or" at the moment, sir.

12.07.28 DANIEL-No "or"?

12.08.20 O'NEILL-There's an "or".

12.09.16 DANIEL-There's an "or"?

12.10.07 CARTER-Sir, you can't just will something to happen  
because you want it to be a certain way.

12.13.19 O'NEILL-Captain, where there's a will, there's an "or".  
Way...

12.18.22 TEAL'C (OS)-If I remain...  
TEAL'C (CONT)-...on this planet, I will eventually be

12.47.05 LIEUTENANT-I'll keep an eye. You help the driver.

12.58.17 O'NEILL-Flat tire?

13.00.06           LIEUTENANT-I'm the one who arranged it.  
LIEUTENANT (OS CONT)-Before I can even think of...  
LIEUTENANT (CONT)-...doing what's asked of me in the  
                  note, I need to know who you are, and who gave it to  
                  you.

13.08.21           TAG READS:  
                  HAMMOND

13.10.21           CARTER-Oh my God. (beat) My name is Samantha Carter,  
                  and you gave me the note, sir. (beat) Sir, before  
                  we left, General Hammond gave me a note and told me  
                  to keep in it my vest pocket until I got to...  
CARTER (OS CONT)-...the other side.

13.28.28           LIEUTENANT-It's addressed to me. In my handwriting.

13.33.11           O'NEILL-What's it say?

13.36.09           LIEUTENANT-"Help them".  
LIEUTENANT (OS CONT)-And seeing as...  
LIEUTENANT (CONT)-...helping you will undoubtedly lead to  
                  court martial, I'd like to know why I would do that.

13.45.02           CARTER-Because it's your idea.

13.46.18 O'NEILL (OS)-Albeit one you won't...  
O'NEILL (CONT)-...have for thirty years.

13.49.27 LIEUTENANT-What?

13.51.25 CARTER (OS)-I know this is kind of hard to understand,  
but...  
CARTER (CONT)-...that's roughly how far back in time  
we've traveled.

14.00.11 LIEUTENANT-I'm sorry. I can't help you.

14.00.09 DANIEL (OS)-Wait!  
DANIEL (CONT)-We can, we can prove it.

14.06.17 O'NEILL-The date... what's the date?

14.08.14 LIEUTENANT-August fourth. (beat) 1969...

14.13.15 O'NEILL-Sixty-nine... What happened in sixty-nine?

14.16.06 DANIEL-The moon landing. (beat) Well, that was just a  
couple of weeks ago, right?

14.21.18 LIEUTENANT-The entire world knows that.



- 14.23.17 O'NEILL-But not too many people know that you watched it from your father's bedside in his hospital room, jut two days after his first heart attack.
- 14.32.24 LIEUTENANT-How did you know?
- 14.34.15 O'NEILL-Because we know you. We will know you. For some reason, thirty years ago, you decided we were gonna need help. Otherwise you wouldn't be standing there with a note... (beat) Now, are you gonna listen to yourself, or not?
- 15.08.11 LIEUTENANT-There are two other men, including the driver.
- 15.10.08 O'NEILL-Thank you, thank you.
- 15.14.05 CARTER-Ow!
- 15.18.02 LIEUTENANT-I'm sorry, Miss. Did I hurt you?
- 15.20.11 CARTER-It's "Captain". And it's all right... Lieutenant.  
Uh, may I see the note?
- 15.30.23 O'NEILL-Look, we don't want to hurt anybody, but we are gonna have to knock those guys out somehow.

15.40.03 LIEUTENANT-Will this do?

15.45.23 O'NEILL-All right, call for help.

15.47.19 TEAL'C (OS)-The dangerous foreign agents you now guard  
have...  
TEAL'C (CONT)-...inexplicably freed themselves.

15.58.10 LIEUTENANT-Help!

16.07.18 O'NEILL-Where's the rest of our gear?

16.08.25 LIEUTENANT-Uh, the Major ordered it shipped in a separate  
truck for security reasons. They should be right  
behind us.

16.13.16 O'NEILL-All right, good. Get down on the ground. Go!

17.09.00 O'NEILL-All right, everything you confiscated from us is  
in these two boxes?

17.12.12 LIEUTENANT-Except for your ray gun, yes.

17.15.01 O'NEILL-Right. (beat) Watch yourself. (beat) All  
right, your Major What's-his-name had videotape of  
this thing in action...

- 17.37.13 LIEUTENANT-Uh, yes. It was in those boxes along with everything else.
- 17.41.24 O'NEILL-Good. Got any cash?
- 17.46.22 LIEUTENANT-Uh, yeah. I might have some... Uh...
- 17.49.10 O'NEILL-That's good. I'll pay you back. With interest.
- 17.56.20 CARTER-One more thing: You have to keep everything you've seen and everything we've told you a secret. And I mean for the rest of your life.
- 18.02.26 LIEUTENANT-General Hammond... I like the sound of that. What are you gonna do now?
- 18.10.00 O'NEILL-Well, you're better off not knowing. But I do want you to know that what I'm about to do keeps you from getting court-martialed. (beat) We should get off this road, find the interstate.
- 18.32.00 DANIEL-So what's the plan?
- 18.33.23 O'NEILL-Find the Stargate.
- 18.36.00 DANIEL-Find the Stargate? That's the plan?

- 18.38.13 O'NEILL-Elegant in its simplicity, don't you think?
- 18,40.25 DANIEL-And if we don't find the Stargate?
- 18.43.08 O'NEILL-There's one in Antarctica.
- 18.45.17 DANIEL-Go to Antarctica. That's a, that's a fabulous  
plan.
- 18.48.11 TEAL'C-Assuming we locate the Stargate, how then do we  
get back to the future?
- 18.51.20 O'NEILL-Well, now, that's all in the note. Right?
- 18.56.02 CARTER-Uh, no, sir.
- 18.58.25 O'NEILL-No, sir...?
- 19.00.00 CARTER-Well, it, it doesn't explain how to get back. At  
least not explicitly.
- 19.07.05 O'NEILL-(reading) "Help them. August tenth, nine fifteen  
a.m.... August eleventh, six-oh-three p.m. That's  
helpful.

- 19.18.06 CARTER-Well, I suppose he had to be intentionally cryptic, so as not to risk changing his own history.
- 19.23.00 O'NEILL-August tenth. That's cryptic.
- 19.25.14 DANIEL-Well, wait a second. That just means that on August tenth at nine fifteen a.m., something is going to happen.
- 19.29.24 CARTER-And happen again the next day at six-oh-three. We just have to figure out what that something is.
- 19.40.28 O'NEILL-Right.
- 19.46.08 O'NEILL-Coming to the top of the hill!
- 19.52.26 O'NEILL-You know, the 'Vette blew it when they went with that body style. They used to be so cool. Carter, stick your thumb out.
- 20.13.04 DANIEL-We should go to New York.
- 20.15.04 O'NEILL-Why?

- 20.16.12 DANIEL-Well, that's where Catherine used to live... or lives.
- DANIEL (OS CONT)-She's probably the only person outside the military who has the...
- DANIEL (CONT)-...slightest idea where the Stargate might be. And I really don't think she's gonna tell us over the phone.
- 20.26.08 CARTER-Daniel, you can't. (beat) In order to preserve our own past, Catherine has to meet you for the first time years from now.
- 20.34.04 DANIEL-So we go in disguise. Pretend to be... foreigners.
- 20.39.21 O'NEILL-How are you gonna do that?
- 20.42.00 DANIEL-Well, I speak 23 different languages. Pick one. (beat) Catherine said herself she began her research in the late Sixties. I mean, who knows? Maybe we're the ones who gave her the idea in the first place.
- 20.59.12 TEAL'C-This method appears to be ineffective.
- 21.03.01 O'NEILL-Teal'c... Teal'c!

21.13.06 O'NEILL-What are you thinking?

21.14.26 TEAL'C-That is effective, O'Neill.

21.19.03 MICHAEL-Hey! We woulda stopped, man!

21.21.20 O'NEILL-Hi. Listen, we've got gas money. Where you headed?

21.26.13 MICHAEL-Upstate New York. Some big concert. Where you headed?

21.29.14 O'NEILL-New York. Back East.

21.31.28 MICHAEL-Hop in.

21.44.05 MICHAEL-Come on, ride up front with me, brother. It's cool. (beat) I'm Michael.

21.56.01 TEAL'C-I am not at liberty to reveal my identity.

21.59.15 MICHAEL-Far out...

22.15.22 DANIEL-Hello.

22.16.12 JENNY-Hi. (beat) So what'd you do?

22.27.06 DANIEL-We didn't, uh... We didn't do anything.

22.32.18 O'NEILL (OS)-We've got a little...  
O'NEILL (CONT)-...problem with the Establishment.

22.38.17 JENNY-I so relate to that.

22.40.06 CARTER (OS)-So if you could take us...  
CARTER (CONT)-...as far as New York, we'd --

22.42.19 JENNY-I really love your hair.

22.46.21 CARTER-Thanks.

22.50.20 O'NEILL-Listen, we could really use some cheap clothes,  
so if you see a cheap clothes place around, we'd  
appreciate it.

22.59.12 MICHAEL-No sweat! (TO TEAL'C) So, uh, your thing...  
that thing... What's it symbolize, peace?

23.11.10 TEAL'C-Slavery to false gods.

23.14.16 MICHAEL-Right on! So, um... It's made out of...?

23.20.02 TEAL'C-Do not discuss it further.



23.21.23           MICHAEL-I dig. It's cool. So, you just go AWOL? (beat)  
                  Hey, we're cool.

MICHAEL (OS CONT)-After the concert, me and Jenny,...

MICHAEL (CONT)-...we're even thinking of crossing the  
                  border up to Canada.

23.37.00           TEAL'C-For what reason?

23.38.22           MICHAEL-You know, man. The War.

23.42.03           TEAL'C-The war with Canada?

23.46.11           MICHAEL-No.

23.55.26           SIGN READS:

25.29.04           CARTER-A flare.

25.31.10           O'NEILL-What?

25.32.07           CARTER-That's the only explanation. We had to have been  
                  sent back because of a solar flare.

25.36.09           TEAL'C-Was there not an error in your calculations?

- 25.38.04 CARTER-I don't think so, Teal'c. But after the Abydos mission, when we couldn't figure out a way to make the gate work again, I was asked to research alternative applications for the gate, including time travel.
- 25.47.23 O'NEILL-What'd you come up with?
- 25.49.06 CARTER-Just this. What if a massive solar flare just happened to occur at the exact moment that we were traveling between Earth and another Stargate? If the...
- CARTER (OS CONT)-...wormhole itself was redirected closer to the sun because of the flare's magnetic field, the increased gravity could slingshot us...
- CARTER (CONT)-...back to Earth.
- 26.08.02 DANIEL-Why haven't we tried this before?
- 26.10.04 CARTER-Because flares are impossible to predict. But light takes several minutes to travel between the Earth and the Sun, so by the time a flare of sufficient magnitude has been confirmed, it's already too late.

- 26.20.01 DANIEL-Okay, if they're impossible to predict, how do we get ourselves home?
- 26.23.19 CARTER-August 10th, 9:15 A.M. It's in the note.
- 26.26.21 O'NEILL-That's the time and date of the next flare.
- 26.28.12 CARTER (OS)-Yeah.  
CARTER (CONT)-General Hammond must've used my own research to figure out what we needed.
- 26.32.10 DANIEL-Or maybe that's the reason he asked you to do the research in the first place.
- 26.35.12 CARTER-And then he looked up two flares in August of '69 that could send us home.
- 26.42.08 O'NEILL-General Hammond, you old son of a -- Hello.  
Soup?
- 26.56.01 MICHAEL-Who are you guys?
- 26.58.23 O'NEILL-Come on. Have something to eat.
- 27.01.09 MICHAEL-Traveling between the Earth and where? What's that about?

27.04.27 CARTER-Well, when I said that, I was just imagining --
