02.09.07 TEAL'C- As well as the Goa'uld technology.

02.10.25 DANIEL- Don't even think about it.

02.12.17 CARTER- Sir, isn't this against regulations?

02.14.09 O'NEILL- I suppose it is, Carter. (beat) Let's go.

02.21.11 DANIEL- Kind of crossing the line there –

02.22.17 O'NEILL- Shut up, Daniel!

03.42.16 GENERAL HAMMOND- As you were. Sorry to keep you waiting. So, what is this  
device you've brought back?

03.49.10 O'NEILL- It's the thing the Tollan used to disable our weapons the last time we were

03.54.20 O'NEILL- Worked on us. And the Goa'ulds.

04.23.12           O'NEILL- Offered us a nice fruit basket, though.

04.26.09           GENERAL HAMMOND- I'm confused. How did you get the device?  
GENERAL HAMMOND (OS CONT)- Major Carter?

04.37.00           CARTER- Uh...

04.37.26           O'NEILL- I took it, sir.

04.39.06           GENERAL HAMMOND- Took it?

04.39.25           O'NEILL- Yes.

04.42.11           GENERAL HAMMOND- You stole it?!

- 04.45.02 O'NEILL- I like to think of it as “borrowed”, sir. Major Carter can figure out how to reproduce it, and we'll give it back.
- 04.52.17 GENERAL HAMMOND (OS)- I can't believe what I'm hearing.  
GENERAL HAMMOND (CONT)- You and your team...  
GENERAL HAMMOND (OS CONT)- stole an alien device from an extremely advanced alien culture.
- 05.00.02 O'NEILL- They won't retaliate, if that's what you're worried about. Not their way.  
Right, Daniel?
- 05.07.08 GENERAL HAMMOND (OS)- This command...  
GENERAL HAMMOND (CONT)- has already been accused of stealing from several other alien cultures, Colonel. Until now, we've denied it. Perhaps that was a bit premature. Dare I ask how many other items you've stolen?
- 05.23.01 O'NEILL- None. This is the first.
- 05.25.19 GENERAL HAMMOND (OS)- Colonel, you don't seem to understand...  
GENERAL HAMMOND (CONT)- how serious this matter is. You and your team have committed a court martial offense.

O'NEILL (OS CONT)- protested.

friendlies.

- 06.41.23 O'NEILL- And when the Goa'uld wipe us out because we have nothing with which to  
defend ourselves, I'm sure we'll all feel great about ourselves and our...  
O'NEILL (OS CONT)- high moral standards.
- 06.49.03 GENERAL HAMMOND (OS)- Colonel O'Neill,...  
GENERAL HAMMOND (CONT)- you are out of line. Now, stand down.

- 09.21.00 DR. FRAISER- Well, I don't see anything immediately wrong with you. Your blood pressure, DRE, and EEG seem normal. It'll be a while before I get your hormone levels and CAT scans back.
- 09.30.14 O'NEILL- Great. Let me know what kind of wacky alien stuff you find in there.

- 09.43.20 O'NEILL- Get out of my way, Teal'c. That's an order.

09.52.09 DR. FRAISER (OS INTO PHONE)- Fraiser.  
DR. FRAISER (CONT INTO PHONE)- Yes, sir. (TO O'NEILL) Colonel, General  
Hammond...  
DR. FRAISER (OS CONT)- wants to see you in his office.

10.19.06 O'NEILL- Carter.

1022.09 CARTER- Sir?

1025.05 O'NEILL- What?

10.26.22 CARTER- Is there anything I can do?

1028.16 O'NEILL- About...?

10.30.17 CARTER- Well, sir... With respect, you aren't exactly acting like yourself.

10.35.11 O'NEILL- No, Carter. I haven't been acting like myself since I met you. Now I'm  
acting like myself.

10.52.10 O'NEILL- Well, look who's here. Come to retrieve your vastly superior stuff? You  
know, it'd be a lot more superior if it wasn't so easy to steal.

- 11.01.27           GENERAL HAMMOND (OS)- Colonel O'Neill!  
GENERAL HAMMOND (CONT)- Get in here and take a seat. Close the door.  
                  (beat) My God, Jack, you've really crossed the line here.
- 11.16.19           O'NEILL- In terms of my insubordination toward you, you're absolutely right,  
                  General. And for that, I'm truly sorry. But I still think what I did was right.
- 11.25.08           GENERAL HAMMOND- I just met with two members of the Tollan High Council who  
                  disagree.
- 11.30.00           O'NEILL- So the Tollan are dictating our policies now, eh?
- 11.32.16           GENERAL HAMMOND- The victims of a crime are demanding that the perpetrator  
                  be dealt...  
GENERAL HAMMOND (OS CONT)- with appropriately.
- 11.37.00           O'NEILL- I'm a criminal?
- 1138.02           GENERAL HAMMOND (OS)- What you've done here...  
GENERAL HAMMOND (CONT)- is clearly a court martialable offense. I have to  
                  press charges.
- 11.45.04           O'NEILL- Well... By all means, General, do what you have to do.

- 11.51.10 GENERAL HAMMOND- I do have one other option I can offer...  
GENERAL HAMMOND (OS CONT)- you, Jack.
- 11.55.06 O'NEILL- What's that?
- 11.56.05 GENERAL HAMMOND- Early retirement.
- 11.59.01 O'NEILL- Now, see, I tried that once before, and you pulled me out of it.
- 12..03.21 GENERAL HAMMOND- The offer is only on the table while you're in this room.
- 12.06.21 O'NEILL- All this for one little indiscretion?
- 12.11.13 GENERAL HAMMOND- Five counts of direct insubordination...  
GENERAL HAMMOND (OS CONT)- to superior officers and an United States  
Senator. Two counts of refusal to obey orders.  
GENERAL HAMMOND (CONT)- Kidnapping an alien child. Should I go on?
- 12.22.11 O'NEILL- The proverbial straw, sir?
- 12.25.05 GENERAL HAMMOND- You got it. I'd accept the offer if I...  
GENERAL HAMMOND (OS CONT)- were you, Jack. Beats the hell out...  
GENERAL HAMMOND (CONT)- of the prison time you'd get otherwise.

12.35.04 O'NEILL- Then I guess I'm retiring.

13.16.19 DANIEL- Hi.

13.20.03 O'NEILL- What do you want?

13.21.28 DANIEL- I'm not, uh, I'm not sure,...

DANIEL (OS CONT)- to tell you the truth. To talk, I guess.

13.26.19 O'NEILL- So talk.

13.35.00 DANIEL- You got another one of those?

13.37.03 O'NEILL- Yeah.

13.39.23 DANIEL- Feel like sharing?

13.42.20 O'NEILL- The beer? Sure.

14.03.15 DANIEL- So... How you feeling about all this?

14.08.15 O'NEILL- Yes to the beer. No to the feelings.



14.13.28 DANIEL (OS)- That’s, uh, that’s too...

DANIEL (CONT)- bad because I don’t really like beer.

14.18.14 O’NEILL (OS)- Stop your worrying.

O’NEILL (CONT)- I’m fine.

14.22.03 DANIEL (OS)- Really? That’s...

DANIEL (CONT)- Um, that’s funny, because I didn’t, I didn’t figure you for the early retirement type anymore. (beat) There’s another reason you’re angry, isn’t there?

14.37.01 O’NEILL- Oh, here we go. Pop Psych 101, right?

14.39.13 DANIEL- No. When we were in the briefing, you said something about the Pentagon not giving us the back-up we requested. What, uh...

DANIEL (OS CONT)- What were you talking about?

14.55.25 O’NEILL- Hammond and I were planning a secondary SGC base off-world. It was gonna serve as a back-up in case our was attacked. I was gonna command.

15.07.10 DANIEL- And the Pentagon pulled the plug?

DANIEL (OS CONT)- So you’re acting up because...

DANIEL (CONT)- you’re hurt because you didn’t get a command.

- 15.16.14 O'NEILL- Give me a break, Daniel.  
O'NEILL (OS CONT)- Their denial of the program...  
O'NEILL (CONT)- was just another indication that they're not serious about attaining  
our goals.
- 15.25.04 DANIEL- Which you think is attaining new weapons and technology?
- 15.27.26 O'NEILL- Protecting ourselves.
- 15.30.19 DANIEL- But isn't our mission also about establishing and maintaining diplomatic  
relations with other cultures?
- 15.35.23 O'NEILL- What's the point if we don't gain anything to help our other interests?
- 15.39.02 DANIEL- Well, there's a lot we could learn from people like the Tollan that has  
nothing to do with technology and weapons.
- 15.44.11 O'NEILL- Stuff that interests people like you, Daniel. Not people like me. (beat) I  
want to see tangible gains from our efforts. And if people like the Tollan don't  
want to share, we should just take.
- 15.58.10 DANIEL- You really believe that?

- 16.00.00 O'NEILL- Being sweet and nice isn't gonna stop three Goa'uld motherships if they decide to come back again.
- O'NEILL (OS CONT)- I'd rather be a thief and alive than honest and dead.
- O'NEILL (CONT)- It's a cliché, but there it is.
- 16.10.13 DANIEL- If you really believe that, I guess, uh... I guess I never really knew you at all.
- 16.16.12 O'NEILL- Come on. You're a bright guy. You had to sense some of this. (beat)
- Then no. (beat) I guess you couldn't relate to me any more than I could to you.
- 16.35.19 DANIEL- So this whole, uh, this whole friendship thing we've been working on the last few years –
- 16.39.09 O'NEILL- Apparently not much of a foundation there, huh?
- 17.24.14 COLONEL MAYBOURNE- Colonel O'Neill.
- 17.28.28 O'NEILL- What the hell? Is this a joke, Maybourne? What are you doing here?
- 17.32.26 COLONEL MAYBOURNE- Well, in a way, you invited me.
- 17.36.13 O'NEILL- Come to gloat about my retirement, have you?

- 17.40.01 COLONEL MAYBOURNE- May I come in?
- 17.41.00 O'NEILL- No. I am in no way obligated to put up with your crap anymore.
- 17.46.00 COLONEL MAYBOURNE- I think you're gonna want to hear what I have to offer  
you.
- 17.50.05 O'NEILL- Offer?
- 18.04.11 COLONEL MAYBOURNE- May I sit down?
- 18.05.14 O'NEILL- No. You won't be here that long. What's this about?
- 18.09.28 COLONEL MAYBOURNE- Well, suffice it to say I've heard about your little  
altercation with General Hammond.
- 18.13.23 O'NEILL- Sweet little grapevine we got there, isn't it?
- 18.15.23 COLONEL MAYBOURNE- Let's just say that I see a lot of paper that goes through  
the mountain. I was most interested in your passionate argument that we  
shouldn't be quite so diplomatic about acquiring the things we need.

18.51.26 O'NEILL- Get out. Not interested.

19.11.09 TEAL'C- For what purpose were we summoned?

19.13.18 DANIEL- My guess is we're getting our fourth.

19.15.25 CARTER- Who do you think it'll be?

- 19.17.27 DANIEL- Well, we'll probably get someone like Ferretti and you'll get command.
- 19.21.08 CARTER- Oh, I don't know about that. They'll probably go with someone higher than Major.
- 19.30.10 GENERAL HAMMOND- As you were. Since SG-1 is considered the flagship...  
GENERAL HAMMOND (OS CONT)- unit, it falls on me to assure that you have the strongest possible leadership.  
GENERAL HAMMOND (CONT)- Therefore I'm reassigning the most senior officer we have in the field as your new commanding officer. Colonel Makepeace...

- 25.39.00 O'NEILL- Your mission,...
- O'NEILL (OS CONT)- Newman?
- 25.40.23 NEWMAN (IN BALL FILTERED)- Use whatever means necessary to acquire goods and technology that can help Earth in the battle against the Goa'ulds, sir, or other unforeseen aggressors.

- 30.53.02 TOBIAS- She beat me out of a position in the SGC.
- 30.57.00 O'NEILL- Oh. So what do you do around here?
- 31.02.04 TOBIAS- My job is to examine some of the larger items we acquire.  
TOBIAS (OS CONT)- The ones that are too big to be transported back to Earth.  
See if we can backwards engineer them, and send the plans...  
TOBIAS (CONT)- home to Colonel Maybourne.
- 31.13.17 NEWMAN- Excuse me, sir. Colonel Maybourne would like to talk to you.

31.16.08 O'NEILL- Yeah. Tobias...

31.24.09 COLONEL MAYBOURNE (OS IN BALL FILTERED)- Jack...

COLONEL MAYBOURNE (CONT IN BALL FILTERED)- I see you made it in one piece. What do you think...

COLONEL MAYBOURNE (OS CONT IN BALL FILTERED)- of our little operation?

31.29.11 O'NEILL- It's swell, Harry.

31.31.05 COLONEL MAYBOURNE (IN BALL FILTERED)- We do what we can to make it comfortable. I have your first mission, Colonel. Planet...

31.38.17 NEWMAN- It's about time we got one of those things.

31.40.19 COLONEL MAYBOURNE (IN BALL FILTERED)- SG-9 was unable to negotiate to get the device.

31.45.06 O'NEILL- What device we talking about?

31.47.05 COLONEL MAYBOURNE (OS IN BALL FILTERED)- Newman can fill you in on all the details.

COLONEL MAYBOURNE (CONT IN BALL FILTERED)- Good luck, Colonel.

MAKEPEACE (CONT)- Jackson, run your tests. Let's see if the intel was right about  
Naquada deposits here.
