- 22.14.16      TEAL'C – Dead.
- 22.15.28      O'NEILL – Let's move.
- 22.36.22      THOR (OS) – Each individual building block is capable of exerting a reactive  
modulating, monopolar energy field on other blocks, allowing the Replicators to  
assemble themselves into many forms. To our knowledge, the interior of each  
block contains the following...
- THOR (CONT) – Two million isolated kiron pathways.
- 22.59.02      CARTER – Oh woah, woah, woah...
- CARTER (OS CONT) – What's a kiron?
- 23.04.14      THOR (OS) – In simplest terms, it is an energy particle.
- 23.08.01      CARTER – I, I've never even heard of it.
- 23.09.29      THOR – Yes. I am aware.
- 23.13.18      CARTER – Well, how am I supposed to figure out how to defeat a kiron-based  
technology if I don't even know what a kiron is?

- 23.19.26 THOR (OS) – The As—  
THOR (CONT) --gaard would never invent a weapon that propels small weights of iron and carbon alloys...  
THOR (OS CONT) – by igniting a powder of potassium nitrate...  
THOR (CONT) – charcoal and sulfur.
- 23.32.25 CARTER – Okay. I get your point.
- 23.34.13 THOR – We cannot think like you.
- 23.39.11 CARTER – Okay. Let’s forget about the kirones and try to put this in terms that I can understand...  
CARTER (OS CONT) – Each block is like its own individual computer...  
CARTER (CONT) – capable of communicating with the other blocks. And multiple blocks come together to form bugs and other things in order to perform various tasks, ultimately for the purpose of replicating.

- 24.03.18 CARTER – I guess you don’t keep any Replicators around for study.
- 24.07.03 THOR – It is too dangerous.

- 24.09.21 CARTER – Of course, that would be stupid. Just out of curiosity, could, say, oh, I don't know, two of the individual blocks replicate?
- 24.19.05 THOR – It requires several blocks working together to make new blocks.
- 24.24.07 CARTER – It's good to know... It's virtual? Wow, it looks real... Wow!
- 24.41.12 THOR (OS) – It will simulate any behavior we have observed.
- 24.59.22 O'NEILL – It's out of control. Nobody's goin' back down in there.
- 25.03.28 DAVIS (OS) – We have to blow up the sub and hope that we can...  
DAVIS (CONT) – contain any of the bugs that survive.
- 25.07.15 O'NEILL – I think it's the only way.
- 25.08.23 DAVIS (OS) – I'll talk to the Pentagon.
- 25.11.09 FRASIER – Colonel?...  
FRASIER (OS CONT) – There is definitely something in...  
FRASIER (CONT) - here... I think you brought back a souvenir.
- 25.44.09 THOR – What is your current thinking process?

25.48.09            CARTER – Sorry. My mind was wandering for a second there.

25.52.02            THOR – You were thinking about the humans on your planet.

25.56.08            CARTER – Yes.

25.58.29            THOR – Colonel O'Neill is a very capable...  
THOR (OS CONT) – human.

26.01.24            CARTER – Yes, I know, but these things are...

26.03.26            THOR (OS, OVERLAPPING) – If we are able to stop the invasion of...  
THOR (CONT) – my world, I promise, we will do all we can to help...  
THOR (OS CONT) – yours.

26.11.19            CARTER – That's a pretty big if.

26.16.01            THOR – Would you like sustenance?

26.19.04            CARTER – Yes. Thank you. I'm starving.

26.27.21            THOR – I like the yellow ones.

26.38.14            CARTER – Oh my God... Sorry.

26.47.24           ASGAARD MESSENGER ON SCREEN – (Asgaardese)

26.50.15           CARTER (OS) – What is it?

26.53.07           THOR – We have lost contact with the rest of the Asgaard ships...  
THOR (OS CONT) – engaging the Replicators.

26.59.18           CARTER – Well, could it be a communication problem?

27.03.06           THOR – No...  
THOR (OS CONT) – The Asgaard ships are not being detected.

27.07.06           CARTER (OS) – So what are those?

27.09.07           THOR (OS) – The Replicators.

27.12.17           CARTER – We’re too late.

27.20.26           DAVIS (OS) – The Dallas is...  
DAVIS (CONT) – standing by in the harbor.

27.23.07           DANIEL – Dallas?

- 27.24.14           DAVIS (OS) – Los Angeles Class attack submarine. On my command it'll target the Blackbird with torpedoes.
- 27.28.15           DANIEL (OS) – You...
- DANIEL (CONT) – should probably put a hold on that. This new block is corroded.
- 27.35.03           O'NEILL – And the significance of that is...
- 27.37.16           DANIEL – Okay, look, uh, the way Sam explained this to me, the bugs use whatever raw materials are around them to replicate, right? And these ones are eating the Russian submarine which means they're basically made of steel or whatever the sub is made of.
- 27.48.24           TEAL'C – That is why they are a different color.
- 27.50.29           DANIEL – And it may also explain why they haven't tried to get off the sub yet.
- 27.54.10           O'NEILL – It does?
- 27.56.17           DANIEL – They can't. You see, they're only as resilient as the raw ma—
- DANIEL (OS CONT) –terials...
- DANIEL (CONT) – they're made of. Uh, these ones aren't like the ones on Thor's ship. They'll, they'll rust or short-circuit in the water. They're less sophisticated and they're vulnerable.



28.08.12           DAVIS – I'm sorry, it sounds like you're now saying that blowing up the sub would easily destroy them. If that's the case, why don't we do it right now?

28.13.16           DANIEL – Because there's still one bug that could survive.

28.15.29           TEAL'C – The one that survived Thor's ship.

28.17.14           O'NEILL – God!

28.19.08           DANIEL – Right...  
DANIEL (OS CONT) – It's the one that started all this by killing the entire crew of...  
DANIEL (CONT) - that sub. We have to be sure this won't happen again.

28.34.10           O'NEILL – Mother bug.

28.36.24           DAVIS – It's a little dark.

28.43.16           DANIEL – It's incorporated itself into the mother bug.

28.48.02           TEAL'C – I will return with you, O'Neill.

28.51.03           O'NEILL – You sure?

28.52.08 DANIEL – Uh, look, every other bug on that sub is probably gonna be pretty upset when you kill mom.

28.56.12 O'NEILL – Yeah, that'd be a fair reaction.

28.59.01 TEAL'C – Could we not create a diversion? Replicators are attracted to bursts of energy, are they not?

29.07.29 O'NEILL – Small charge on the upper level, draw 'em away from mom. They're in a containable situation. Now's our shot.

29.16.06 SILER – Uh, sub's diesel engines just started.

29.18.23 DANIEL – The Replicators are tryin' to move?

29.21.22 DAVIS – We're anchored for now, but you better get out there before they decide to dive.

#### ACT FOUR

29.43.26 CARTER – So how long before they reach your planet?

29.47.09 THOR – Two hours.

- 29.50.11 CARTER – Your ships can go much faster than lightspeed. I, I've seen you fly clear across the galaxy in no time.
- 29.55.18 THOR – Yes.
- 29.56.29 CARTER – So why are the bug ships traveling so slow?
- 30.00.14 THOR – In order to generate the sub-space field required to travel at hyper-speed, the full power of the generators is required. Presently, they are using that power to replicate.
- 30.13.11 CARTER – So if they did decide to go to hyper-speed it would also mean no shields or weapons.
- 30.17.09 THOR – Yes. But remember, the Replicators do not care about time, as we do.
- 30.24.17 CARTER – Right. They're not in a hurry. Yeah, how did they get control of your ships in the first place?
- 30.31.06 THOR – The Replicators are capable of modifying our own weapon technology beyond our understanding.
- 30.37.29 CARTER – But I thought they learned everything they know from you.

- 30.40.07 THOR – It is possible they have gathered knowledge from sources other than the Asgaard.
- 30.45.14 CARTER – The bottom-line is we can't touch them but they could easily take over the ship or blow it to smithereens if they wanted.
- 30.52.07 THOR – Yes.
- 30.53.03 CARTER – So why don't they?
- 30.54.18 THOR (OS) – We have shown no signs of aggression. And this...  
THOR (CONT) – ship's technology is less advanced than the ships they currently occupy.
- 31.05.19 CARTER – I'm not really helping, am I?
- 31.16.05 O'NEILL (OS, FILTERED, ON MONITOR) – Charge is set.
- 31.17.06 SILER – They're submerging.
- 31.19.18 DAVIS – Yes sir.
- 31.20.10 DANIEL – Jack, the sub is diving.

- 31.30.27 O'NEILL – Yeah, we got that. Head to the battery deck.
- 31.38.06 DANIEL – We're losing their signal.
- 31.39.13 DAVIS – It's okay, the sub can't dive below periscope depth running on a diesel engines.
- 31.42.21 SILER – Underwater radio transmission...  
SILER (OS CONT) – boosters launched.
- 31.44.28 DANIEL – How do they get out if the sub's underwater?
- 31.46.19 DAVIS – An escape hatch, there. Yessir.
- 31.56.23 THOR (OS) – You are tired.
- 32.00.17 CARTER – Yeah.
- 32.02.10 THOR – It is another advantage the Replicators have over us. They do not require rest.
- 32.11.16 CARTER – But they do have to eat.
- 32.13.17 THOR – Yes. In order to replicate.

- 32.16.20 CARTER – And they are what they eat, right? What’s the strongest material you know of?
- 32.22.10 THOR – We have just developed a new alloy of Naquadah, Trinium, and Carbon. It was used to create the hull...  
THOR (OS CONT) – of the O’Neill.
- 32.31.17 CARTER – Can that ship reach hyper-speed yet?
- 32.34.10 THOR – Yes.
- 32.36.02 CARTER – Can it be flown using auto-pilot or some sort of remote control?
- 32.40.09 THOR – Why?
- 32.41.02 CARTER – So we can get the Replicators to chase after it.
- 32.43.26 THOR – It is possible. However—
- 32.46.21 CARTER – That ship is everything they’re looking for. It’ll look like an all-you-can-eat buffet.
- 32.51.07 THOR – But it is not completed. They will capture it and consume its technology.

- 32.56.12 CARTER – Not if you rig it to self-destruct.
- 32.59.26 THOR – I do not understand.
