TEAL'C (OVERLAPPING INTERRUPTING) – I wasn't here last week.

DANIEL – You said we were friends and you said we had to escape and I'd really like an explanation.

TEAL'C – I said no such thing.

DANIEL - He was there, Kegan. You heard him. Why would he deny that?

KEGAN – Nightsickness affects your mind.

- DANIEL That doesn't explain the dreams I've had. Something's wrong here, Kegan. Something's not—
- KEGAN (INTERRUPTING) Carlin. It's bad enough he named you as part of his delusion. Now people hear you talking like this they're gonna think you're nightsick.

DANIEL – People?

KEGAN – Not that I would ever-- Carlin.

DANIEL – No, no, no, of course not. It's just a dream.

11.55.07 CALDER (OS) – Why didn't the memory stamp work on Teal'c?

11.57.24 BRENNA – I'm sure it was the creature his species carries within them. We've stamped him again. This time it seems to be holding.

- 12.05.07 CALDER What about the others?
- 12.06.14 BRENNA They're all proving to be excellent workers. In fact, Therra has some very interesting ideas...
- 12.11.14 BRENNA (OS CONT) for improving the plant.

#### CALDER – Therra?

- 12.14.29 BRENNA The personality we stamped Major Carter with. We've been having some problems with pressure overload. She suggested an automated relief valve...

BRENNA (OS) – Yes, Administrator.

14.03.17 CARTER (OS CONT) --ed right away--

BRENNA (INTERRUPTING) - We can't do the improvements.

14.07.19 CARTER – But you said before—

BRENNA (OS INTERRUPTING) - No. They would re--

14.09.17 BRENNA (CONT) –quire the generators to be off-line for too long. If any of the critical systems began to freeze we might not be able to get them started again.

14.16.04 CARTER – I agree there's some risk.

14.17.19 BRENNA – Too much risk.

14.21.06 CARTER – Okay, well, uh, what about my other ideas?

- 14.25.13 BRENNA I'm sorry. This plant is all that stands between us and the...
- 14.38.21 BRENNA (OS CONT) ice. Uninterrupted production is more important th--

14.31.15 BRENNA (CONT) –an efficiency. You may return to work.

- 14.37.21 CARTER Brenna, I know you were excited about this. What's happened?
- 14.40.28 BRENNA Well, I've thought it over

14.43.06 CARTER – Well at least let me come up with a safer way—

BRENNA (OS INTERRUPTING) - Therra...

14.46.17 BRENNA (CONT) – Please leave.

14.53.05 CARTER – It's my honor to serve...

15.04.21 CARTER (CONT) – It's not like I'm making this up off the top of my head. No, I've got a detailed plan...

CARTER (OS CONT) – including safeguards.

O'NEILL - I'm sure she knows that.

15.12.16 CARTER (OS) – Look...

CARTER (CONT) - I could make a difference here. She won't even let me.

21.49.21 DANIEL (CONT) – Look, I just think I'm s'posed to be doing something more important.

21.53.27 CARTER – We're helping our people survive an ice age.

21.56.06 O'NEILL – Yeah, what's more important than that?

21.58.02 DANIEL – I don't know. Look, I just have this feeling that all of us are part of some bigger, grander thing.

22.13.07 O'NEILL – Well I certainly understand what you're talkin' about.

- 22.16.24 DANIEL You do?
- 22.17.17 O'NEILL No.

22.19.17 DANIEL – Look, I don't know how to explain this but I had this dream. You were in it.

- 22.26.26 O'NEILL Me?
- 22.28.25 DANIEL There was this big, glowing puddle.
- 22.31.16 O'NEILL Okay, just stop talking, right now.

22.34.07 CARTER – Wait a second, Jonah. I had the same dream.

22.36.27 O'NEILL – Will you two stop talkin' like that, for cryin' out loud? It's an expression. Right?

22.48.10 DANIEL – Look, we can't talk right now. Let's meet after lights out.

23.39.24 DANIEL (OS) – So?

CARTER - So?

- 23.42.07 DANIEL Did you have the same dream?
- 23.45.11 O'NEILL About you?

23.46.24 CARTER – No. About the shimmering circle of water.

23.49.03 O'NEILL – No. My dreams are about other things.

23.57.12 DANIEL (OS) – Tor said we had to...

23.58.07 DANIEL (OS CONT) – escape...

24.0.11 DANIEL (CONT) – He also said we had to remember. Remember what?

24.02.26 O'NEILL – Well I remember when I was foreman, anyone caught doing what we're doing right now had their rations cut in half for a month.

24.09.17 CARTER – Well we'll have to risk it.

24.11.17 DANIEL – What if our memories have been somehow altered?

24.14.02 CARTER – Well if that's true then we can't be sure of anything.

24.16.27 O'NEILL – My memory's fine.

24.19.03 DANIEL – Really?

24.20.09 O'NEILL – Yeah.

24.21.28 DANIEL – What'd you do in the mines?

24.25.11 O'NEILL – I mined.

24.27.08 DANIEL – No, what did you do?

24.30.08 O'NEILL – I remember shoveling ore into a cart.

24.33.19 DANIEL – And?

24.36.23 O'NEILL – I did that a lot.

24.45.07 CARTER – I remember a feeling of cold and darkness.

24.48.07 DANIEL – And that's where the two of you met?

- 24.50.05 O'NEILL Yeah.
- 24.51.25 CARTER Really?

24.55.01 O'NEILL – Sure. So what's this important thing we're s'posed to be doing?

25.03.05 DANIEL – I told you I don't know. I keep tryin' to remember but all I, I come up with are images of this place.

25.11.06 CARTER – But if you're right then everything we remember about this place is a lie.

- 25.47.17 CARTER Well it's an expression. Isn't it?

26.40.16 FRASIER – I take it they have something we want.

26.43.19 HAMMOND – They're quite advanced in metallurgical and chemical technolo--

26.47.08 HAMMOND (OS CONT) –gies.

FRASIER – Well we must have something they want or they wouldn't have proposed trade.

26.50.22 HAMMOND – Stargate technology. Gate addresses.

26.53.22 FRASIER – Yeah, well, I understand that. They're surrounded by ice.

26.56.26 HAMMOND – As far as I am concerned they need us a helluvalot more than we need them. Apparently Administrator Calder doesn't seem to think so. Frankly, I think he likes things just the way they are.

27.08.15 FRASIER – Doesn't leave you with many options, does it, sir?

27.10.25 HAMMOND – No it doesn't. Which is why I've ordered Major Griff to draw up a covert search and rescue plan.

27.18.05 FRASIER – Well, if, if you're looking for volunteers, sir?

- 27.21.13 HAMMOND Thank you, Doctor. I'll keep that in mind.
- 27.52.08 O'NEILL Any more dreams?

DANIEL (OS) - I saw the pool of light again...

27.59.09 DANIEL (CONT) – Except this time we were all there. Including Tor.

28.04.24 O'NEILL – I've dreamed about mining. Naked.

28.15.28 DANIEL – Therra?

28.17.06 CARTER – Uhm, a lot of numbers and letters keep popping into my mind. SG-1...

28.23.28 CARTER (OS CONT) – DHD, GDO.

DANIÈL – Sounds like gibberish to me.

28.29.29 CARTER – Well it must mean something.

28.34.17 O'NEILL – Excuse me.

- 28.48.06 CARTER Jonah?
- 28.54.26 O'NEILL (OS) That means something.
- 28.57.29 CARTER What is it?
- 29.00.08 O'NEILL I don't know yet...
- 29.11.21 O'NEILL (CONT) Very impressive.
- 29.28.07 KEGAN I see you made some new friends.

DANIEL – Yeah.

- 29.32.08 KEGAN Carlin.
- 29.33.15 DANIEL I'm sorry, Kegan.
- 29.45.11 ATTENDANT (OS) I don't understand. His condition's getting worse...
- 29.48.06 ATTENDANT (CONT) Here, let me check his wound.
- 29.50.04 BRENNA (OS) Under no cir—

BRENNA (CONT) –cumstances are you to remove those bandages...

29.56.04 BRENNA (CONT) – Just make sure he continues to eat and drink.

30.36.01 O'NEILL – I remember something. There's a man. He's bald and wears a shortsleeved shirt. And somehow he's very important to me. I think his name is Homer.

CARTER – Doesn't ring a bell.

O'NEILL - You?

CARTER – Just a lot of vague images. You know there are things about this place that I like.

O'NEILL - Really? Would it mean anything if I told you I remember something else?

CARTER – What?

O'NEILL - Feelings.

CARTER - Feelings.

O'NEILL – I remember feeling feelings.

CARTER – For me?

O'NEILL - No. For Tor. I don't remember much, but I do remember that.

CARTER - So?

O'NEILL – So, uh, I'm just saying.

32.21.00 BRENNA (OS) – For some reason Tor seems to be having an adverse reaction to the memory stamp. I, I think he may be dying.

32.28.11 CALDER – Workers die. What about his friends?

BRENNA – I've received a report. They've been gathering together in secret. Administrator, I think that they're starting to remember. Their brain chemistry is

slightly different than ours. That could be the reason. But we can re-stamp them.

CALDER - No...

32.49.29 CALDER (CONT) - No, I think it's time they found out what it was like outside.

- 32.53.18 BRENNA All they really did was disapprove of our treatment of the workers.
- 32.57.14 CALDER No, no. No, they did much more than disapprove. They passed judgment on us, Brenna. I'm simply doing the same.

33.11.05 BRENNA – Yes sir.

CALDER (OS) – Brenna...

33.15.13 CALDER (CONT) – If for some reason you can't comply with my

33.16.12 CALDER (OS CONT) – orders—

BRENNA – It's an honor to serve, Administrator.

33.21.09 CALDER – Yes it is.

34.11.09 O'NEILL – Very impressive...

34.14.23 O'NEILL (OS CONT) – Too bad it's a lie.

34.19.04 CALDER – I don't understand.

34.20.28 O'NEILL – While we were on the grand tour, Carter spotted some ventilation shafts coming out of, apparently, no where. We checked it out.

34.28.22 CALDER – You were supposed to stay with your escort.

34.30.26 O'NEILL – Yeah. I can see how you wouldn't want outsiders to know about the slave labor force you keep underground.

34.39.04 CALDER – They're merely workers.

34.40.26 O'NEILL – And what made them so worthy of that?

34.45.20 CALDER – Colonel—

O'NEILL (OS) – Administrator...

34.51.12 O'NEILL (CONT) – I will not recommend trade with a culture that enslaves its own people. I don't care what kind of technology you have to offer.

35.01.06 CALDER – This system of government has allowed our culture to survive an ice age.
