01.45.20        HAMMOND- Where's Teal'c?

01.48.29        O'NEILL- I don't know, Sir. He was right behind me.

03.01.10        HAMMOND-Colonel, are you okay?

03.02.12        O'NEILL- We have to go back, Sir.

03.05.27        HAMMOND- What was your situation?

03.07.02        CARTER- We were being pursued by gliders and an Alkesh.

03.10.15        O'NEILL- Teal'c was right with me. He could still be alive.

03.13.14        HAMMOND- Dial P3X-116. We'll try and raise him on his radio.

03.22.01        TECHNICIAN (OS)- Chevron one encoded.

03.23.07        CARTER- Sir, we should have a MALP standing by just in case we need a visual.

03.26.00           HAMMOND- Do it.

03.27.03           TECHNICIAN- Yes, sir.  
TECHNICIAN (OS CONT)- Chevron two encoded.  
TECHNICIAN (CONT)- Sir, we're getting an unknown error. Sir, should I over-ride?

03.38.18           HAMMOND- Major?

03.39.10           CARTER- Gate feedback protocol means the system's detecting something wrong  
                          with the Stargate itself, not our dialing computer.

03.45.22           TECHNICIAN (OS)- Chevron four encoded.

03.47.08           DANIEL- Like what?

03.48.17           CARTER- I don't know. It's something our computer isn't recognizing. Sir, what  
                          happened just before you jumped through?

03.56.10           O'NEILL- The ship was coming right at us.

03.58.06           CARTER- You think it could have impacted the Stargate on the other side?

4.00.24            O'NEILL- And if it did?

04.03.19 CARTER- Well, I hate to say this but if the wormhole was shut down while Teal'c was en route...

04.08.24 TECHNICIAN (OS)- Chevron six encoded. Still showing an unknown error, Sir.

04.11.24 CARTER- Sir, we, we better abort.

04.13.27 HAMMOND- Abort the dialing procedure.

04.15.08 TECHNICIAN (OS)- Dialing sequence aborted, Sir.

04.27.02 HAMMOND (OS)- So, the Tok'ra...

HAMMOND (CONT)- intel was right. The Goa'uld were scouting P3X-116 for a new base.

04.33.08 DANIEL- Looks that way. What the Tok'ra didn't tell us is that the Goa'uld in question was Tanith. We just spotted him on the ground near his Alkesh with a small contingent of Jaffa when a Glider made our position.

04.41.24 HAMMOND- He came after you himself?

04.43.13 DANIEL- Yeah. As you know, he and Teal'c have this kinda thing between them.

04.47.28 CARTER- Sir, I think I know what the problem is, but we have to act quickly.

04.51.09 HAMMOND- What is it?

04.53.00 CARTER- Okay, well you know how the Stargate turns matter into energy and then transmits it through a subspace wormhole.

04.58.10 DANIEL- That's gate travel 101.

05.00.09 CARTER (OS)- And the gate...

CARTER (CONT)- on the receiving end is what translates the energy signature, and re-converts it back into the matter's...

CARTER (OS CONT)- original form.

05.05.26 HAMMOND- Major...

05.06.21 CARTER (OS)- The Stargate has massive amounts of memory...

CARTER (CONT)- inside it. It's like a computer buffer. It temporarily stores the energy patterns before it re-converts them back into matter. Now it does this to make sure that it's got all the information before It reassembles the object, or in our case, a person.

CARTER (OS CONT)- The error we're receiving from the gate seems to indicate...

CARTER (CONT)- that there is still an energy pattern stored in the memory buffer.

05.30.15 DANIEL- Teal'c?

- 05.31.14 CARTER (OS)- It the Alkesh crashed into the DHD on the other...  
CARTER (CONT)- planet, it would have cut off power to the outgoing gate. The wormhole would have been severed prematurely. Now if that happened before our gate was able to re-convert Teal’c’s energy signal back into matter...
- 05.43.28 HAMMOND- Teal’c is in our Stargate.
- 05.45.21 CARTER- His energy signature, yes. Stored in the memory.
- 05.50.09 DANIEL- Well let’s get him out.
- 05.51.26 CARTER- Right now, I’m not sure how. (beat) That’s not the worst problem.
- 05.59.00 DANIEL- There’s worse?
- 06.00.17 CARTER (OS)- The Stargate has various...  
CARTER (CONT)- protocols designed to prevent different energy signatures from getting mixed together. Now one of the ways it does this is by erasing the memory buffer every time a new wormhole is established.  
CARTER (OS CONT)- It’s like an overall system reset.  
CARTER (CONT)- Sir, if we dial out of our gate, or somebody off world tries dialing in...
- 06.18.13 HAMMOND- We have eight teams currently on missions.

- 06.20.18 CARTER- Teal'c's energy signature will be erased. Permanently.
- 06.25.22 HAMMOND- How do we stop an incoming wormhole?
- 06.27.25 CARTER- Right now the iris is just in front of the plane where the event horizon is formed. If we can rig it so we can offset it just slightly, we would effectively stop a wormhole from establishing. It would be like burying our gate. Siler says his team could have it done in an hour.
- 06.43.15 HAMMOND- How do we get our people home?
- 06.46.06 DANIEL- When the Russian's had their DHD connected to their Stargate, it, it became the dominant gate on Earth.
- 06.50.22 CARTER- Exactly. All incoming wormholes automatically went there.
- 06.54.10 HAMMOND- I'll call the Pentagon.
- 06.55.25 DANIEL- I'll go find out how long we have before the next SG team is due back.
- 07.12.19 HAMMOND- Yes, sir, we have eight teams off-world we have to get home. It's a temporary situation we hope to have resolved as quickly as possible. Thank you, Sir. I'll get our best man for the job on a plane right away.

- 07.29.06 DANIEL- The next team due to check in is SG-5. They have, ah, scheduled to report at 1600 hours.
- 07.33.16 HAMMOND- Less than an hour from now. Will the iris be in place?
- 07.36.14 DANIEL- They're working as fast as they can.
- 07.39.13 HAMMOND- The best man I was talking about is you.  
HAMMOND (OS CONT)- We need a liaison in Russia to help coordinate our interests.  
HAMMOND (CONT)- Pack a bag. You leave in half an hour.
- 08.01.16 O'NEILL- Carter.
- 08.02.25 CARTER- Sir, are you okay?
- 08.05.07 O'NEILL- Oh, couple stitches, concussion, nausea, dizziness. The usual. Why is Teal'c still in the gate?
- 08.18.08 CARTER- Well, Sir, it is very complicated.
- 08.21.23 O'NEILL- Can I help?



08.26.20 CARTER- Well, in order to overcome the lack of a DHD, we had to create a proper interface between the gate and our...  
CARTER (OS CONT)- computer. We generated a series of instructions based on electrical...  
CARTER (CONT)- impulses to which the gate's control crystals would respond, now that these were found...  
CARTER (OS CONT)- mostly by trial and error over a great deal of time.  
CARTER (CONT)- What we need to do now is find a series of impulses that will...  
CARTER (OS CONT)- instruct the gate to override one of its primary functions.

08.51.28 O'NEILL- Can I get you some coffee?

08.57.02 CARTER- Sir, the truth is, the gate may not even be capable of doing what we need it to do.

09.01.18 O'NEILL- Which is, what?

09.03.17 CARTER- Resume a re-integration process that was cut of prematurely.

09.06.12 O'NEILL- Carter? My head.

09.08.21 CARTER (OS)- Sir...

CARTER (CONT)- I'm sorry. But the more I go through this, the more I'm becoming concerned that we may not even be able to get Teal'c back.

09.18.07 O'NEILL- Oh.

09.56.13 CHEKOV- Major Davis.

09.57.06 DAVIS- Colonel.

09.57.03 CHEKOV- Dr. Jackson.

09.58.13 DANIEL- Colonel.

09.59.10 CHEKOV- I trust you had a pleasant trip.

10.01.00 DAVIS- As possible under the circumstances.

10.02.26 CHEKOV- Yes, yes, an unfortunate problem. Please. Sit down. The details made available to me were somewhat vague. Only that the technical glitch had somehow trapped one of your team inside the inner workings of the Stargate.

10.21.21 DANIEL- That's pretty much all we know at the moment.

10.24.27 CHEKOV- Then it seems that we are not the only ones incapable of handling every situation the Stargate may present after all.

10.31.19 DAVIS- What is the current status of our off-world teams?

- 10.33.26 CHEKOV- All of them have been contacted successfully. SG-5 and SG-8 have already arrived safely.
- 10.41.00 DANIEL- We do appreciate what you're doing.
- 10.42.19 CHEKOV- Despite appearances, our participation in this effort is not one of good faith, Dr. Jackson. The Russian military is not here to do your bidding.
- 10.51.13 DANIEL- I wasn't suggesting you were.
- 10.53.11 CHEKOV- Your government seems to think it can dictate protocol in all matters regarding our Stargate technology.
- 10.56.22 DAVIS- Our governments do have a deal...
- 11.00.24 CHEKOV- One which has been blatantly ignored by both...  
CHEKOV (OS CONT)- sides, wouldn't you agree?
- 11.05.00 DAVIS- It is technically and logistically impossible to run concurrent Stargate programs, Colonel.
- 11.11.23 CHEKOV- By the sounds of it, it may be impossible not to, Major.
- 11.34.03 HAMMOND- Colonel. (beat) Colonel. Go home.

- 11.47.26 O'NEILL- No, I'm all right, Sir. I just got five minutes of quality sleep.
- 11.55.15 HAMMOND- Everything that can be done, is being done.
- 12.02.05 O'NEILL- You know, this wouldn't be happening if he had followed orders. It's that damn Jaffa revenge thing.
- 12.10.23 HAMMOND- Get some rest, Colonel. That's an order. (beat) Colonel Simmons.
- 12.31.16 SIMMONS- Hello General, I was just introducing Major Carter and Dr. McKay.  
SIMMONS (OS CONT)- The doctor has been studying the Stargate...  
SIMMONS (CONT)- program out of Area 51 for over a year now.
- 12.42.05 CARTER- Without access to a working gate?
- 12.44.11 MCKAY- I had the virtual computer model that was built when the second gate was there, so.
- 12.48.02 HAMMOND- I'm sure it's a thrill to be here to see the real thing.
- 12.52.21 MCKAY- Not really.
- 12.55.00 SIMMONS (OS)- The Pentagon feels that Dr. McKay has become...  
SIMMONS (CONT)- the world's foremost expert on the gate.

- 12.59.02           HAMMOND- Next to Major Carter.
- 13.00.25           MCKAY- Well, with all due respect, Major, you spend most of your time in the field.
- 13.04.13           HAMMOND (OS)- Major Carter spent two years working on the gate...  
HAMMOND (CONT)- prior to her five years...  
HAMMOND (OS CONT)- of service at the SGC. She's the one who...  
HAMMOND (CONT)- who made this program viable.
- 13.13.03           MCKAY- Actually, the interface she designed is full of flaws.
- 13.17.00           CARTER- Well, I admit it's not perfect, but...  
CARTER (OS CONT)- it's certainly...
- 13.19.05           MCKAY (INTERRUPTING)- It has caused numerous unnecessary situations, any of  
                          which could have ended in catastrophe.
- 13.23.00           SIMMONS- And we certainly don't want that to happen. That's why the Doctor's here  
                          to help.
- 13.26.29           HAMMOND- Good. He can report to Major Carter.

13.29.16 SIMMONS (OS)- And the two of them might be able to work together to solve this problem...

SIMMONS (CONT)- to get Teal'c back in one piece. In the time allotted.

13.35.23 CARTER- Excuse me? In the time allotted?

13.40.02 SIMMONS- 48 hours.

13.41.18 CARTER- Sir...

13.43.22 HAMMOND- Come with me Colonel.

13.47.19 MCKAY- Whoo!

13.52.13 HAMMOND- I don't care who you are, or who your work for, you will not come into my facility and dictate...

HAMMOND (OS CONT)- procedure to me.

13.57.04 SIMMONS- Oh, General, don't shoot the messenger. I'm just bringing you your orders.

14.01.07 HAMMOND- Teal'c is an invaluable asset. Without him, you very well might not be standing there...

HAMMOND (OS CONT)- supposedly representing your country.

- 14.08.10           SIMMONS- We're all aware of his contributions, as well as his questionable allegiances.
- SIMMONS (OS CONT)- Now this operation we've lost a lot of good Americans.
- SIMMONS (CONT)- You're not gonna tell me that you hold Teal'c's life above one of our own people, are ya?
- 14.20.28           HAMMOND- Teal'c is one of our own. And his life is not lost yet.
- 14.24.07           SIMMONS- Maybe not. But my sources tell me that all the off-world teams are home safe.
- SIMMONS (OS CONT)- Now, the Pentagon is not willing to deal with the Russians over the long-term.
- SIMMONS (CONT)- And in the past, you yourself have made a very strong case for keeping the SGC alive and running at all cost.
- SIMMONS (OS CONT)- And we agree with ya.
- SIMMONS (CONT)- So these people are either gonna have to come up with a solution...
- SIMMONS (OS CONT)- within the next two days, or you will be order to resume...
- SIMMONS (CONT)- sending teams through the gate.
- 14.53.00           CHEKOV- All of your teams have arrived safely. That is what we agreed to help you with.

14.57.03 DANIEL- Now all we need to do is send one of our teams of on a, a sort of fact-finding mission. One of our off-world allies may know of a way to save Teal'c.

15.03.13 CHEKOV- Your off-world allies?

15.05.00 DANIEL- Allies of Earth.

15.06.06 CHEKOV- As long as our gate is connected, Dr. Jackson, we, as in the Russian people, are vulnerable to attack.

15.11.25 DAVIS (OS)- We are here to...

DAVIS (CONT)- ensure the orders agreed upon by our respective leaders are carried out. We're not here to negotiate with ya, Colonel.

15.18.23 CHEKOV- On the contrary, Major. That is exactly why you are here. The deal so unwisely made by my government requires us to cease our operations of the Stargate. Not make it available to you whenever you deem it necessary. If you wish to continue to use our technology, you must finely present something of significant value in return.

15.41.14 MAYBOURNE- Hi, Jack.

15.44.19 O'NEILL- You rat...

O'NEILL (OS CONT)- bastard!



- 15.46.23           MAYBOURNE- Hey, hey...  
MAYBOURNE (OS CONT)- hey, hey, hey, hey, hey. Take it easy!
- 15.49.03           O'NEILL (OVERLAPPING)- I'm so gonna kick your ass!
- 15.50.21           MAYBOURNE (OS)- But there's...  
MAYBOURNE (CONT)- people watching.
- 15.52.04           O'NEILL- I don't care.
- 15.53.12           MAYBOURNE- Look, it wasn't me. I didn't shoot ya, Jack.
- 15.56.03           O'NEILL- I trusted you!
- 15.57.16           MAYBOURNE- No, come on, would I come back here like this if I'd done it?
- 16.00.00           O'NEILL- You might.
- 16.01.16           MAYBOURNE- I swear, Jack.
- 16.03.10           O'NEILL- Well, then who did it?
- 16.04.16           MAYBOURNE- I don't know.

- 16.05.25 O'NEILL- What do you know?
- 16.07.17 MAYBOURNE- Just what I read in the N.I.D. file. That you got shot...  
MAYBOURNE (OS CONT)- and the Goa'uld escaped.
- 16.12.13 O'NEILL- You came all the way back to Colorado Springs just to tell me you didn't do  
it?
- 16.17.08 MAYBOURNE- I didn't think you'd believe me any other way. And I wanted to warn  
you.
- 16.21.13 O'NEILL- About what?
- 16.22.18 MAYBOURNE- I heard about Teal'c.
- 16.24.24 O'NEILL- What about it?
- 16.26.04 MAYBOURNE- I hope you get him back.
- 16.28.20 O'NEILL- And the warning part?
- 16.30.05 MAYBOURNE- Watch out for Frank Simmons.
- 16.31.21 O'NEILL- Simmons again, what is it with you guys?

16.34.12 MAYBOURNE- We go back. I don't exactly know what he's up to, but I can guarantee you it isn't going to be good for Teal'c or the SGC.

16.42.00 O'NEILL- Great.

16.42.24 MAYBOURNE (OS)- I'll be in town for a couple of days.

MAYBOURNE (CONT)- I'd like to see how things turn out. If you need me, I'm at the Accent Inn, checked in under the name of Cassidy.

16.50.07 O'NEILL- David or Shawn?

16.52.16 MAYBOURNE- Butch.

16.55.19 O'NEILL- You know, Simmons says you're the one who sullied...

O'NEILL (OS CONT)- the good name of the N.I.D.

17.02.21 MAYBOURNE- Do you believe that?

17.08.00 O'NEILL- No.

17.10.12 MAYBOURNE- Trust me, Jack. I know him well. I'm the one who recruited him.

17.24.03 MCKAY- Thanks. Major.

- 17.28.10 CARTER- Doctor.
- 17.29.29 MCKAY- I guess that we got off on the wrong...  
MCKAY (OS CONT)- foot.
- 17.32.00 CARTER- What probability factor did you use figuring that out?
- 17.35.14 MCKAY- For the record, I don't work for Colonel Simmons.
- 17.38.17 CARTER- What difference does that make?
- 17.40.26 MCKAY- I sensed a little tension...  
MCKAY (OS CONT)- there.  
MCKAY (CONT)- I'm on the Air Force payroll. I report directly to the chief of staff.
- 17.46.03 CARTER- Ah, well that changes everything.
- 17.48.11 MCKAY (OS)- I just ah, wanted to give you my honest analysis...  
MCKAY (CONT)-Major. It's a waste of time to assume you're right about everything,  
so I just thought we'd get past that.
- 17.56.00 CARTER- Leaving more time to devote to your fan club.

- 18.00.05 MCKAY- The gate wasn't meant to be used without a dialing device. Your computer system ignores 220...
- MCKAY (OS CONT)- of the 400 feedback signals the gate can emit during any given dialing sequence.
- MCKAY (CONT)- It is a fluke that you picked up the buffer warning. For that matter, I'm surprised that you even bothered to abort the dialing procedure despite the error.
- 18.16.23 CARTER- What is that supposed to mean?
- 18.19.02 MCKAY- I've read the reports, Major. You've ignored error data and by-passed dialing protocols on several occasions to get a lock.
- 18.24.10 CARTER- My job is to present the risks, not to decide whether to take them. Now if you have something positive to add, do it. Otherwise, get out of my lab.
- 18.32.15 MCKAY- Well.
- 18.34.24 CARTER- Carter.
- 18.36.06 DANIEL- Hey, Sam. We got the Russians to agree to let us send one team out.
- DANIEL (OS CONT)- SG-5 Contacted the Tok'ra. They just got back.
- 18.42.05 CARTER- What did they say?

- 18.43.03 DANIEL- They said the glitch probably occurred because we don't have a DHD.  
DANIEL (OS CONT)- They said a local DHD would have compensated for the loss of power...  
DANIEL (CONT)-and allowed the gate to finish the reintegration process.
- 18.51.29 CARTER- Well, if the DHD could have prevented the problem, maybe the DHD can also fix it.  
CARTER- Is there any chance you could get the Russian's to give us their DHD?
- 19.00.10 DAVIS (OS)- Consider what I've just proposed...  
DAVIS (CONT)- to you.
- 19.01.00 CHEKOV- This is impossible at the moment.
- 19.03.06 DANIEL- Not without giving back Alaska.
- 19.06.16 CARTER- That bad, huh?
- 19.07.12 DANIEL- Yeah, besides, the Tok'ra warned us that connecting a DHD now might not be the way to get Teal'c out of...  
DANIEL (OS CONT)- the memory.
- 19.12.12 CARTER- It could impose the reset protocol the same as dialing in would.

19.15.05 DANIEL- Yep.

19.15.28 CARTER (OS)- So, how do the Tok'ra suggest we fix the problem?

19.18.14 DANIEL- They don't know. They said they'd work on it, but they didn't say how long that might take.

DANIEL (OS CONT)- Sorry I don't have better news.

19.24.26 CARTER- Yeah, me too. Thanks, Daniel.

19.35.20 HAMMOND- Thank you. I will.

19.39.12 SIMMONS- Can I come in?

19.40.10 HAMMOND- Do I have a choice?

19.46.25 SIMMONS- The clock is ticking. You have less than 32 hours.

19.51.00 HAMMOND- You didn't close the door just to tell me that, did ya Colonel?

19.54.02 SIMMONS- You know, the way I see it General, despite their combined brainpower, Major Carter and Dr. McKay are not going to be able to solve this problem in the time allotted.

20.02.01 HAMMOND- I'm working on extending that. (beat) Why are you really here, Colonel?

20.13.25 SIMMONS- I can provide you wit the information you're gonna need to save Teal'c.

20.18.28 HAMMOND- How?

20.19.24 SIMMONS- That's not important.

20.21.02 HAMMOND- It damn well is.

20.22.15 SIMMONS- What's important is that this information is not gonna be for free.

20.27.05 HAMMOND- Are you speaking officially on behalf of the N.I.D. because I can't believe  
what I'm hearing.

20.30.27 SIMMONS- Why don't we just stick to the point, General.

20.32.27 HAMMOND- I'm trying to count how many crimes you might be committing...

HAMMOND (OS CONT)- right now, Colonel.



20.36.20 SIMMONS- General, the way I see it, you have two options. You can wither give me what I want. A small token compared to what's at stake, at least for you. Or I guess you could pick up the phone...

SIMMONS (OS CONT)- call your superiors and report this conversation.

SIMMONS (CONT)- At which point I would deny everything.

20.53.23 HAMMOND- I'm thinking of having you arrested this instant.

20.58.15 SIMMONS- Well, you go ahead. And I guarantee you, you'll never see Teal'c again.

21.35.04 MAYBOURNE- I could take care of him for ya.

21.37.17 O'NEILL- What?

21.38.08 MAYBOURNE- Simmons. I could make sure he's never a problem again. I'm already wanted for treason. It would be my pleasure, Jack.

21.44.25 O'NEILL- Okay. I'll just pretend you didn't say that.

21.47.12 MAYBOURNE- I bet it was him that shot you. The son of a bitch really stood there in Hammond's office and blackmailed him right to his face?

21.57.17 O'NEILL- Yeah.

- 21.59.04 MAYBOURNE- Got to admire that. What did he ask for?
- 22.02.04 O'NEILL- A Goa'uld hand device.
- 22.05.26 MAYBOURNE- Might as well be admitting that they have the Goa'uld that escaped.
- 22.09.02 O'NEILL- We're hoping.
- 22.10.19 MAYBOURNE- Why?
- 22.11.21 O'NEILL- Because he might tell us what he told Simmons.
- 22.14.04 MAYBOURNE- They have to find him first. (beat) Oh.
- 22.21.13 DAVIS- This is unacceptable.
- 22.25.15 CHEKOV- We allowed all your teams to return home safely.  
CHEKOV (OS CONT)- We even allowed you to send out another team on a new  
reconnaissance mission.  
CHEKOV (CONT)- We want nothing less than everything on that list in return.
- 22.36.12 DAVIS- Your government agreed to allow us to use your gate. Period. It, it mentioned  
nothing of any, any demands.

- 22.42.22 CHEKOV- Russia will not stand by and allow you operate your program without our direct involvement. We demand that a Russian team be permanently stationed at your base. That all missions files will go through our on-sight officer. And that all technologies procured and developed as a result of Stargate travel, past, present, and future will be shared equally.
- 23.04.09 DAVIS- Or what? We already know your government has no interest in running its own program.
- 23.10.19 CHEKOV (OS)- Political winds change, Major.  
CHEKOV (CONT)- And don't forget, with the DHD we can insure that our base has the dominant operational gate.
- 23.19.15 DAVIS- You do realize, Sir, that what you're talking about could be interpreted as an act of war.
- 23.25.16 CHEKOV- Don't be ridiculous. How can the United States go to war over something its people know nothing about?
- 23.31.17 DAVIS- It wouldn't be unprecedented, Colonel.

23.34.23 DANIEL- What would it take for you to give us your DHD? (beat) No, seriously. Let's put it on the table. I mean, we all know you think of the DHD as your long-term bargaining chip, but...

DANIEL (OS CONT)- everything has a price. No one's said exactly what it would take...

DANIEL (CONT)- buy you out in full right now.

23.51.13 DAVIS- Dr. Jackson...

23.52.15 CHEKOV- No, no, he has a good point. The problem is, Dr. Jackson, that without full disclosure of technologies already procured by the SGC, it may be impossible to determine a reasonable price.

24.16.18 O'NEILL (OS)- Didn't the N.I.D. trace you down...

O'NEILL (CONT)- the last time you did this?

24.20.26 MAYBOURNE- Well, this time I'm using a link-up that's bouncing off five different satellites. If they pick something up, tracing it will make them dizzy for a month.

24.27.29 O'NEILL- What are we looking for?

24.29.05 MAYBOURNE- The N.I.D. have several bases for their special ops throughout the country. Call them safe houses.

24.35.25 O'NEILL- Legitimate organization.

24.38.01 MAYBOURNE- It's the only way we're going to find this Goa'uld, Jack.

24.42.10 O'NEILL- What do you mean?

24.43.04 MAYBOURNE- Through legitimate N.I.D. operations. Unofficial business is financed through the private sector and can be kept off the books.

MAYBOURNE (OS CONT)- But any official N.I.D. action has to be filed with the Pentagon.

MAYBOURNE (CONT)- Same as any branch of the military. See, if Simmons used an N.I.D. plane to visit our snake head, then the flight plan was registered.

25.02.04 O'NEILL- Wouldn't that be stupid?

25.04.21 MAYBOURNE-The situation with Teal'c obviously provided Simmons with a unique opportunity, but the Pentagon's deadline didn't give Simmons much time.

MAYBOURNE (OS CONT)- Besides, N.I.D. flight plans are classified information.

MAYBOURNE (CONT)- And there aren't many people who would know the current location of every N.I.D. safe house in the...

MAYBOURNE (CONT)- country. (beat) You just happen to be lucky enough to now one of the few who does.

25.31.15 O'NEILL- He diverted to Minot, on his way to Colorado Springs.

- 25.35.05           MAYBOURNE- North Dakota ain't exactly on the way
- 25.40.07           MCKAY (OS)- There's no switch.  
MCKAY (CONT)- The crystals are wiped clean by an unstable vortex of a forming wormhole. Hmm. You have any idea how much excess energy one of those blasts gives off?
- 25.54.26           CARTER- As a matter of fact, I do. Now what we need to do is find a way to establish an event horizon without the vortex.
- 26.00.16           MCKAY (OVERLAPPING)- That's impossible.
- 26.01.05           CARTER- I've seen it done before.
- 26.02.08           MCKAY- What, by magical fairy beings? Is there lemon on the chicken?
- 26.05.21           FOOD SERVER- It's lemon chicken.
- 26.08.17           MCKAY- So it is. I'm mortally allergic to citrus. One drop of lemon and I could die. I'll have whatever that is. (beat) I have to be very careful. (beat) So, what would this fictional event horizon be connected to?

26.38.12 MCKAY- Starving. Shockingly, this is even worse than it looks, but ah, it beats a hypoglycemic reaction.

26.47.20 CARTER-The event horizon is what dematerializes you and sends you into the wormhole. And maybe we don't have to connect to a wormhole...  
CARTER (OS CONT)- in order to form an event horizon.

26.55.28 MCKAY- Maybe, somehow, some way.

26.58.27 CARTER- All we need to do is get the re-materialization process to work.

27.02.02 MCKAY- Major, even if you managed to create a viable event horizon without connecting to a wormhole, you'd never get the gate to reintegrate Teal'c.

27.10.27 MCKAY (OS)- The crystals that retain the energy patterns...  
MCKAY (CONT)- before reintegration, they're not like magnetic hard drives.

27.48.29 CARTER- We're dealing with a level of quantum physics here that is way beyond us.

27.52.09 MCKAY (OS)- More than a third...

MCKAY (CONT)- of the energy pattern that will tell the gate requires to reintegrate Teal'c, it's already gone.

27.57.01 CARTER- I don't think so.

27.58.19 MCKAY- You're guessing wildly. Like you always do.

MCKAY (OS CONT)- Maybe you can eventually find a way to fool the gate...

28.27.07 MCKAY- I wish I didn't find you so attractive. I always had a real weakness for dumb  
blondes.

28.38.07 MCKAY- Very sexy. Very, very sexy.

29.16.18 MR. BLACK- We have a breach in the perimeter. Section r-nine.

- 29.20.02 VOICE (VO)- I got it. It's probably that damn squirrel again.
- 29.22.17 MR. BLACK- You better take back up, Joe. Joe, report. (beat) Joe. Paul, check on  
Joe. Take Peter.
- 29.38.07 VOICE (VO)- We're on it.
- 29.42.09 MR. BLACK- We have a power failure here at home base. I'm switching to back-up  
generator. (beat) We have a red alert. Back-up generator is down. System
