01:23:36:13 O'NEILL: How heavy?

01:23:37:29 CARTER: The gate weighs 64,000 pounds, sir.

01:23:41:00 O'NEILL: That's heavy.

01:23:42:16 CARTER: And you'll need to reach an altitude exceeding 180 kilometers.

01:23:45:26 O'NEILL (OVERLAPPING): At minimum escape velocity before I release the gate, or it'll fall back to Earth. I know, I know.

01:23:51:17 CARTER: Well, based on the X-302's rocket fuel capacity, even a full burn won't do it, which means the other engines are going to have to get you part way up hauling something that weighs six times greater than they were designed to carry.

01:24:01:28 O'NEILL: Yeah. Carter--

01:24:02:27 CARTER (INTERRUPTING): The whole rig isn't exactly aerodynamic, either.

01:24:05:14 O'NEILL (OVERLAPPING): Carter...I'm not sure I want to know any of this.

01:24:09:18 CARTER: They're working on lightening the 302, but that's why you're going  
alone. Believe it or not, every pound counts.

01:24:15:23 O'NEILL: I shouldn't have had that cake.

01:24:19:03 CARTER: I wish I could go with you, sir.

01:24:21:02 O'NEILL: Yes, I'm sure you do, and I find that quite bizarre. Anything else?

01:25:58:15 O'NEILL: What exactly did you remove?

01:26:01:10 MURPHY: Weapons, some of the life support...Don't worry. There's still more than  
a day's worth.

01:26:05:26 O'NEILL: Well, if I need more than an hour, we're all in trouble.

01:26:08:15 MURPHY: Right. We also took out radar, some of the crash safety mechanisms,  
landing gear...

01:26:14:21 MURPHY: We had to in order to properly accommodate the clamping system, so once you re-enter the atmosphere, you're going to have to eject. That is, after you target the 302 to splash down off the coast of Florida.

01:29:24:01 O'NEILL (O/S FILTERED): Full port engine failure, starboard at 6-0%.

01:29:29:12 O'NEILL: Preparing to ignite rocket booster.

01:29:33:08 MURPHY (O/S FILTERED): You're still too low, Starflight.

01:29:36:01 O'NEILL (O/S FILTERED): I'm losing velocity, Command. I'm going to start  
losing altitude.

01:29:41:19 O'NEILL (CONT'D): Command, please advise.

01:29:47:01 MURPHY: Okay, Starflight, go with main engine burn.
